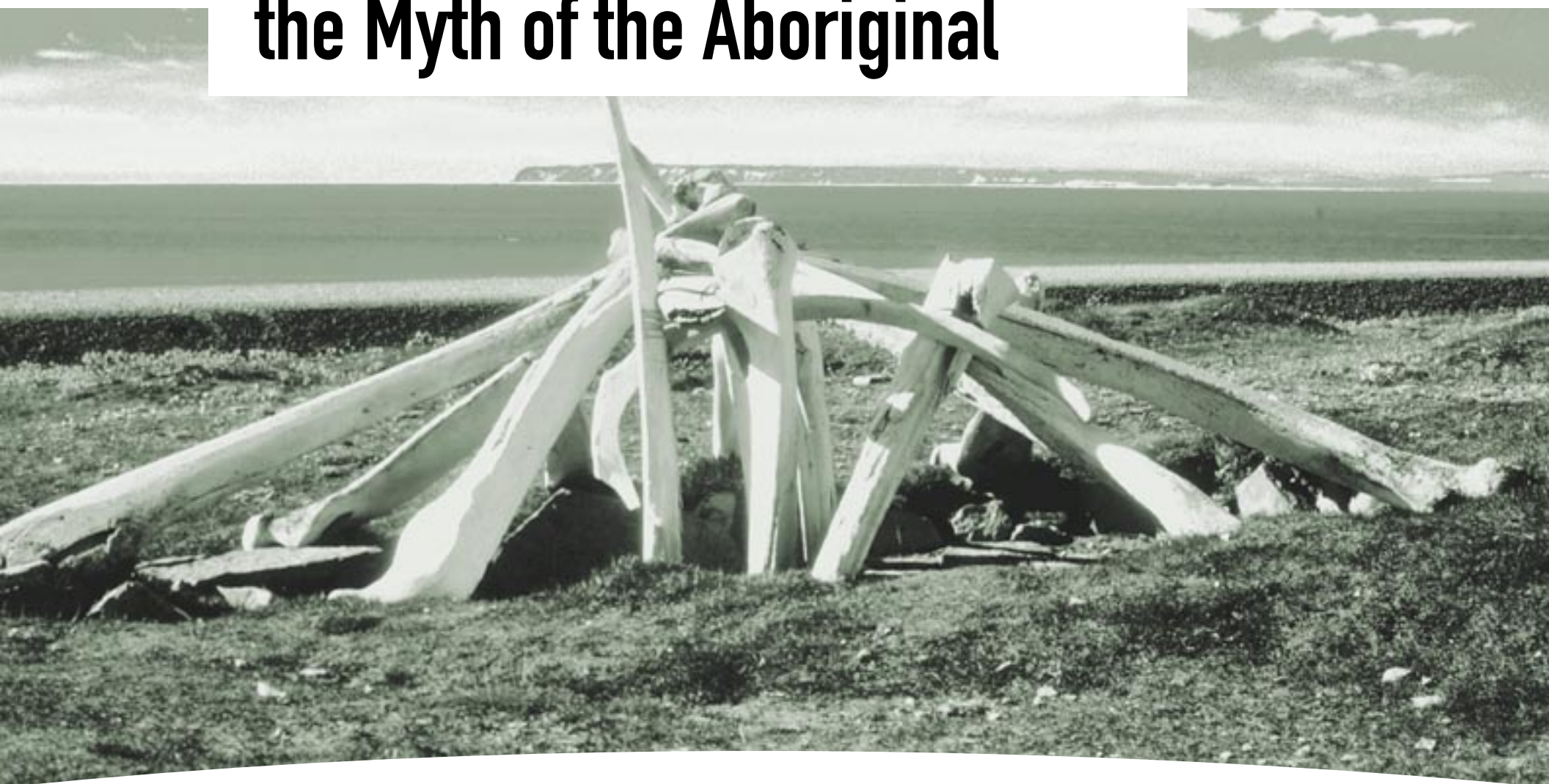


**Robert McGhee**

# Archaeology, Inuit History, and the Myth of the Aboriginal

Robert McGhee is an Arctic archaeologist whose fieldwork has taken him from Labrador to the Mackenzie Delta and northwards to the High Arctic islands, the Russian far east and Arctic Norway. He has excavated the remains of Sir Martin Frobisher's sixteenth century Northwest Passage expeditions; dug a 2000 year old Eskimo village on the Siberian coast of Bering Strait; worked with the High Arctic Inuit community of Resolute Bay in reconstructing an 800 year old village; and crewed for a portion of the Atlantic crossing by the reproduction Viking ship Gaia.
