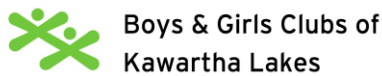

Youth Justice Committee:

The Youth Justice Committee relies upon a team of skilled volunteers to facilitate restorative conferences. Community members who are interested in becoming volunteers must submit an application, attend an interview, and complete a mandatory training course. All volunteers are subject to review and approval by the Ministry of the Attorney General.

Community Mediation Program:

The Community Mediation Program offers mediation supports for adult neighbours in

conflict. Volunteers are trained to the Ontario Community Mediation Coalition (OCMC) standards and receive ongoing mentorship & training.

Aspire Program:

The Aspire Program aims to support young adults, aged 17 – 25, achieve their training and employment goals through mentorship. We are currently recruiting volunteers with a variety of backgrounds and work experience. Full training is provided as well as many other opportunities for personal and professional growth.

Kawartha Sexual Assault Centre

The Peterborough Regional Health Centre is a state-of-the-art regional hospital with a proud local history extending back over a century. The Health Centre is located in Peterborough, Ontario, Canada – a 90-minute drive north-east of Toronto.



Funded by the Province of Ontario through the Central East Local Health Integration Network, PRHC opened a new, single facility in 2008, serving a population of 300,000 people in Peterborough and the surrounding region. With

a capacity of 494 beds, our regional hospital has one of the busiest Emergency Departments in Ontario, and offers an extensive range of services, including specialized programs in renal, stroke, cardiac, cancer care and vascular surgery. The Health Centre is also the region's largest employer with 2,200 staff, 370 physicians with privileges, and 600 volunteers.

Telecare Distress Centre of Peterborough

Telecare offers anonymous, confidential, nonjudgmental, empathetic telephone listening to worried, stressed, lonely and overwhelmed individuals.

Volunteers must complete 50-hour training and screening. Volunteers are asked to shift 4 hours every two weeks and attend monthly on-going training meetings. Volunteers work out of the Telecare office.
