Summer Term:

The candidate will also teach one 0.5 course during the summer session.

Candidates must be able to teach at the Peterborough campus and be available for meetings and service. Candidates should have a completed Ph.D., as well as demonstrated excellence in teaching and research in areas relating to Gender and Women's Studies.
