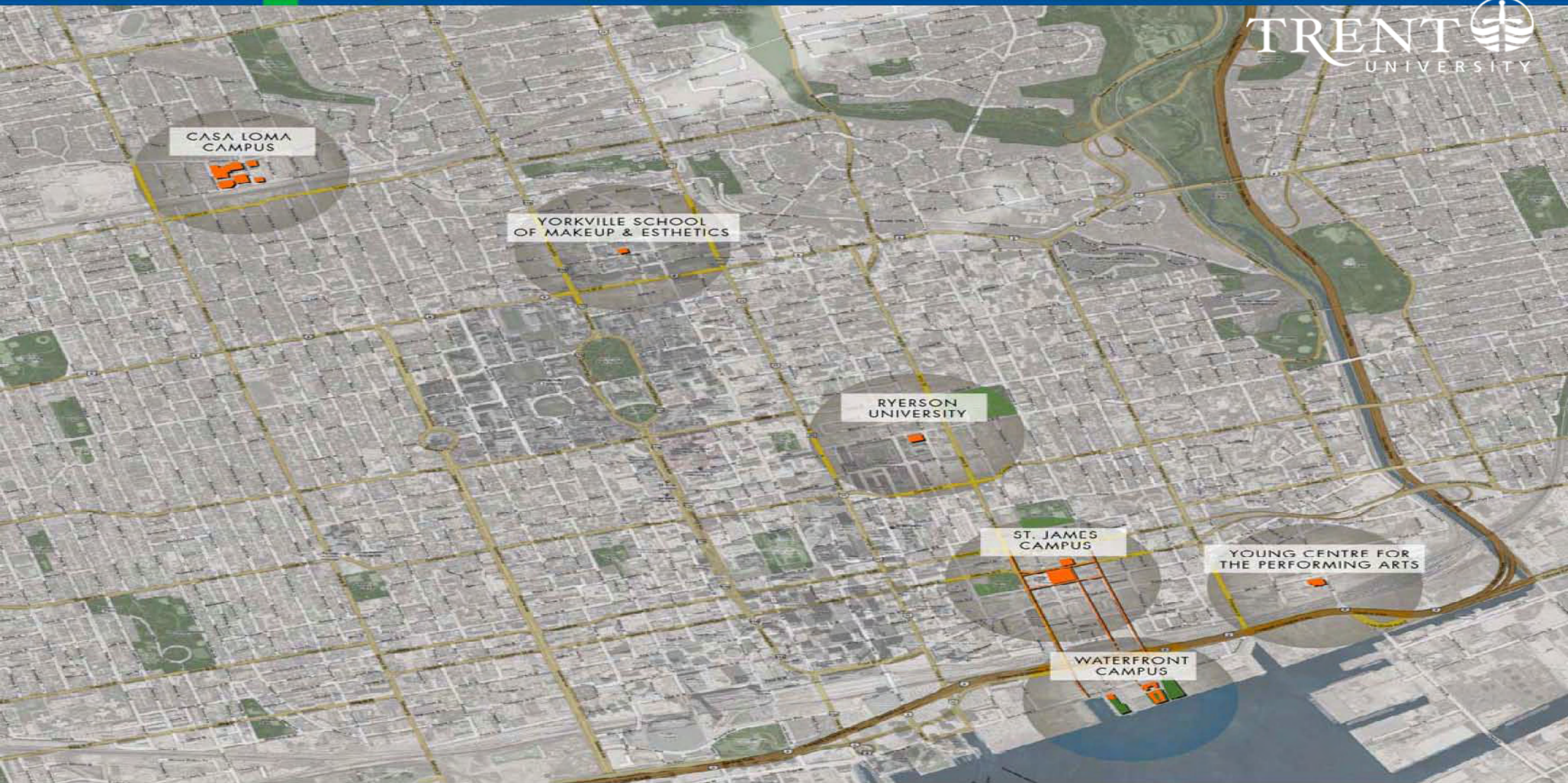
- A state-of-the-art PSE campus in the heart of Ontario's newest and most high profile development on Toronto's Waterfront

- Increase participation rates in PSE

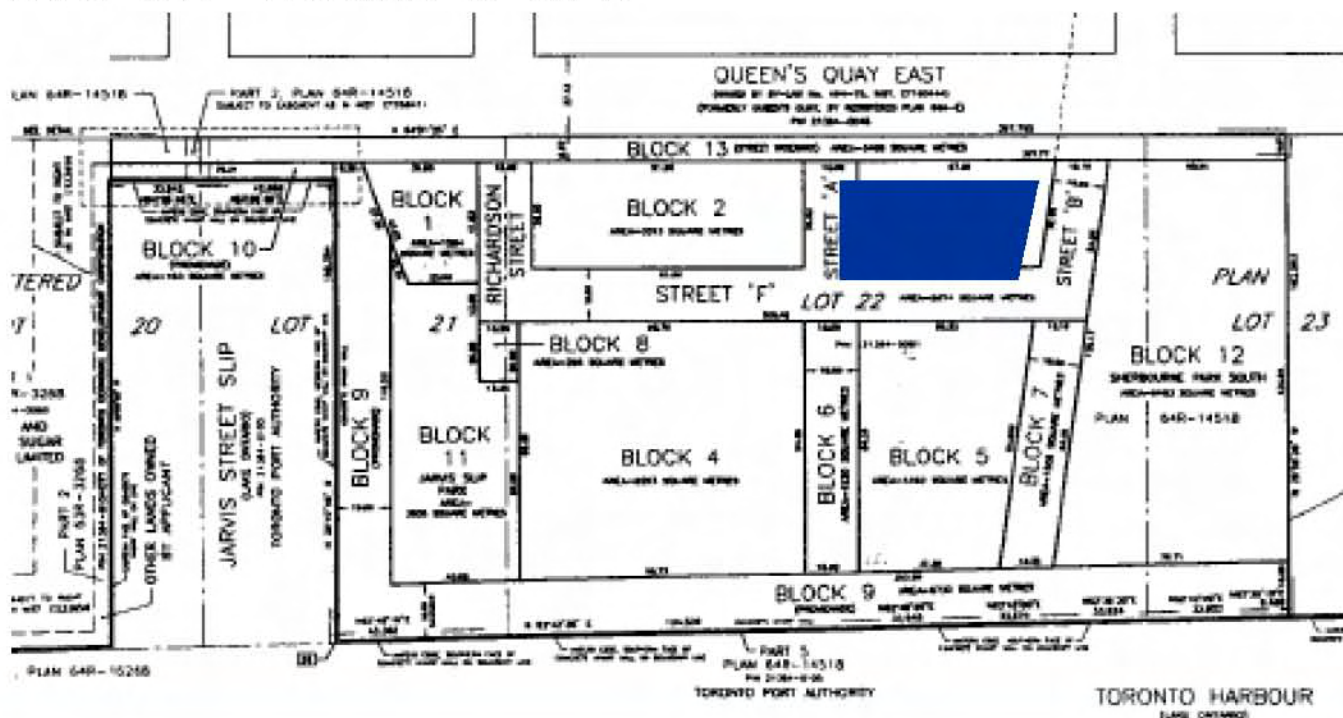


George Brown Toronto Locations





- Advanced negotiations with Waterfront Toronto to develop state-of-the-art Health Sciences facility and integrated student residence and recreation centre on Blocks 3 & 5



- Health Sciences Expansion has been GBC's number 1 priority since 2003
- GBC has committed \$25M towards estimated \$88M cost
- Seeking government contribution toward the \$65M balance to help create space for 3,500 students
- GBC will seek private partners to build residence and sports/recreation complex



2007-Expanding the Vision Phase 2 and beyond – Why?

- Increased focus on PSE capacity challenge in GTA
- Desire to respond to system design policy goals with emphasis on simple, seamless student friendly pathways
- Maximize student opportunity for learning and minimize cost to taxpayer
- In response, GBC and Trent developed learning consortium proposal

- 7,500 new PSE spaces
- Integrated diploma/degree/graduate pathways
- Complements Health Sciences focus
- Priority to applied learning and research
- Tailored to high-impact sectors in GTA
- Innovation in system design for Ontario
- Accelerated build out and animation of site
