A Busy Fall in Research

From September 21 thru to November 24, 2016 the Office of Research & Innovation successfully submitted over 62 applications to 20 different funding programs (provincial, federal, and international) with funding requests in excess of \$14,117,205! At present, there are over 435 active programs of research being administered by the Office of Research & Innovation.

Certifications and Regulatory Compliance has also been active with over 83 new protocols submitted in support of human subject, animal, and biohazardous research. At present, there are over 298 active ethical protocols registered with the Office of Research & Innovation.
