Economics at Trent

Economics students study the impact that individuals, businesses, financial institutions, and governments have on the economy. Students will use national and international data to explore trends and tendencies and to test economic models, and through their studies, gain an understanding of the methods and tools required to analyze complex economic issues such as inflation, unemployment, and the regulation of the market structure.

Economics students are equipped with the necessary knowledge of economics for understanding and dealing intelligently with current topics like economic growth, income inequality, the environment, globalization, and various forms of market regulation. Besides the importance of understanding contemporary social issues, economics students develop career skills for business, law, teaching, public administration, and research integral to the workplace.

Why Trent Co-op?

Trent students are problem-solvers, critical thinkers, and excellent communicators. Our co-op students are ready and eager to take on new learning experiences, which means your workplace gains a team member with fresh ideas, diverse perspectives, and valuable knowledge. With our university-wide Indigenous Course Requirement, our students gain a foundational understanding of the history, traditions, cultures, and knowledge of Indigenous peoples which is an essential perspective they can bring to your organization. Hosting a Trent co-op student allows you to instill core skills and expertise early on in students' careers which will benefit your future recruitment and hiring efforts.

Traditionally there are 3 separate co-op work terms of paid employment, each 4 months long, minimum 35 hours/week, giving students the opportunity to manage well-defined special projects at your organization. With the Economics co-op, students are encouraged to combine two work terms back-to-back creating an 8-month opportunity with one employer.

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
