A message from our College Principal

Dear Traillites!

Welcome to February! As an historian, I am a big proponent of Black History Month. It is easy to get sidetracked with the daily rhythms and stresses of everyday life. That is why marking February as a special time to reflect, understand, and appreciate the Black experience in Canada is important to us as a society.

I am currently writing a chapter in my next book on education in early Canada. In my research, I found records from an eighteenth-century Nova Scotia school where both free and enslaved black children studied together. These were students of a similar age, studying a similar curriculum, with similar texts, who lived very different lives outside of the classroom. Today, I find it difficult and painful to imagine the inherent inequity and prejudice that existed for those children. Yet, to achieve positive change we must stop and take a moment to hold the mirror up (to both past and present events) to keep working for a better society. And, as one student reminded me last year, Black History Month also gives an opportunity to celebrate Black achievement and resilience.

In that spirit, Theodore Schwartzenhauer, our library intern, has curated a display that illustrates a selection of non-fiction and fiction books from the College Library that deal with Black history and culture around the world. Throughout the College, you will find – free for the taking – a special graphic novel on stories of Black Canadians. For special events across Campus, I would recommend you go to this [site](#).

Last Sunday, we had our most recent **Sunday College Dinner** where over 103 students, friends, and families were fed. A special thank you for the congregation at Emmanuel United for their continued hospitality. Our next free **Sunday College Dinner** will be on February 22nd and I need your help. 

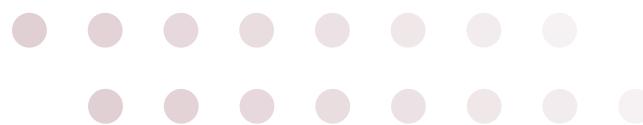

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

In Canada



Jean Augustine was born in St. George's, Grenada and came to Canada in 1960. After 30 years of serving several community causes in Toronto, she ran for federal parliament in 1993. She won the seat for Etobicoke-Lakeshore making her the first Black MP in Canadian history. In 1995, she was instrumental in having the House of Commons recognize Black History Month officially in Canada.

A lifelong advocate for human rights, in 2008 she became the first Fairness Commissioner for the Province of Ontario. She visited Traill College in 2017 where she was given a scarf and made an honorary fellow.







30 Minute Dinner Rolls

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup warm water
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup vegetable oil
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup granulated sugar
- 2 tablespoons active dry yeast
- 1 large egg, beaten
- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter, softened
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 to 4 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 tbsp milk, room temperature


INSTRUCTIONS

- In a large bowl, combine 1 cup water, oil, sugar, and yeast. Let sit until yeast is bubbly (about 8 minutes). Stir in beaten egg, softened butter, and salt.
- With a stand mixer or by hand, add flour, one cup at a time until you have a soft dough that isn't sticky. Knead by hand 10 minutes or 5 minutes with a stand mixer.
- Divide dough into 18 even pieces, and form into balls. Place in a greased pan and cover with parchment paper and a kitchen towel.
- Let rise for 15-30 minutes
- Lightly brush with milk and bake at 400°F on the middle rack for 10-12 minutes or until golden.



How to Keep Warm in Winter

- Dress in Layers: Bundle up! Long underwear, sweaters, and even hats indoors can help keep your body heat close.
- Keep Your Feet Warm: “house slippers” or warm socks should be worn indoors. Be sure to keep your feet dry and remove old, damp socks.
- Heat Up Your Bed: Use a (safe) electric blanket that turns itself off, or a hot water bottle with a wool or fleece cover
- Harness the Sun: During the day, open the blinds and curtains on the south-facing windows—and let in the warming sunlight!
