GET A STUDY PERMIT (**



We strongly recommend that you apply for your study permit online as soon as you receive your letter of acceptance. You can learn more about the application process on the **Immigration**, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada Website. Do note, you can begin your program online from outside Canada, even if your study permit, TRV, or eTA have not yet been processed. *Do note there is risk: if you start your studies online and are later denied your study permit, you will not be granted a refund past the refund deadline.

ENSURE YOUR IMMUNIZATIONS ARE UP TO DATE



The Public Health Agency of Canada recommends that you're vaccinated for specific illnesses as a visitor to Canada. If you can't receive these vaccinations before arriving in Canada, please visit the **Trent Student Wellness Centre.**

UNDERSTAND YOUR HEALTH INSURANCE



International students are enrolled in 2 health insurance plans.

(1) The University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)

A mandatory primary healthcare plan that can help cover the costs of medical services. Everything you need to know about UHIP can be found at uhip.ca. You will be enrolled in UHIP automatically on the first day of the term based on course registration. After you arrive in Canada, follow these instructions to print your UHIP card.

If you are arriving in Canada prior to the start of the term, apply for early registration: MyTrent Portal > Support > Health and Wellness > UHIP E-card request

Won't be in Ontario to start your studies? Opt-out the first month of each term. MyTrent Portal > Support > Health and Wellness > UHIP Opt-out form

(2) Trent Student Benefits (Student VIP Plan)

A supplementary health-care plan provided through Trent's student union, which can help with additional medical costs (e.g. prescription medication, dental, vision, etc) not covered by UHIP. You are automatically enrolled on a 1.5-course credit enrollment. **Download** your card on the first day of your enrolled term here.

REGISTER FOR ORIENTATION



Orientation events are currently being planned for new graduate students which will take place throughout August and possibly into early September. From GTA's, to Student Services to Finances to Library Services, you will be provided with everything you need to know to start your journey as a graduate student at Trent. PREPARE FOR THE CLIMATE



Central Ontario's climate ranges from up to 35°C in the summer, to 0 to -20° C in the winter. You will need different kinds of clothing to stay comfortable all year round.

Winter (Dec.-Feb.): The key to loving winter is dressing appropriately. Layering, sweaters, long underwear, down jacket, hat, mittens, boots. Summer (June-Aug.): lightweight clothing

Spring (March-May) and fall (Sept.-Nov.): sweaters and lightweight waterproof coat.

PREPARE TO WORK IN CANADA



On-campus:

International students registered full-time at Trent may be permitted to work on-campus without a work permit. Students must possess a valid study permit with stated working conditions, and if they have not undergone a medical examination, students may be subject to specific terms and conditions. Read about the full conditions on the

IRCC website.

Off-campus:

You may qualify to work off-campus without a work permit if you have a valid study permit with working conditions, are full-time enrolled, and are studying in a program that leads to a degree, diploma, or certificate that is at least six months in duration. If you qualify, your study permit will allow you to work up to 20 hours per week during regular academic sessions and full-time during scheduled breaks, such as the winter and summer holidays or spring break. Co-op/Internships:

If you have been accepted into a co-op program, you will require a co-op work permit.

EXPLORE BLACKBOARD LEARN BL



Blackboard Learn is the learning system you will use to access your courses. Your courses won't appear until several days prior to the start of classes, however, you can take some time to explore the platform. You can find the Blackboard Learn platform in the MyTrent portal.

PACK YOUR BAGS

If you'll be living in residence, check out the "what to bring to residence" packing list. You can purchase big items near campus to avoid taking up space in your suitcase. For clothing, you'll want items for a wide range of temperatures. If you don't already own winter items, you may want to wait and buy them in Canada.

Be sure to make copies of your important documents and carry the originals with you in your carry-on luggage. Check IRCC and the Trent website for updated entry to Canada requirements before your departure.

- Passport
- TRV or eTA (if required)
- Port of Entry Letter of Introduction from IRCC (don't forget to show this to get your Study Permit at the airport)
- Letter of Acceptance from Trent
- Proof of funds
- Immunization record
- Quarantine plan
