# **ECON Single Major – 9.5 ECON credits (20 credit Honours degree)**

#### Level 1000 Required Courses (1.5 credit):

ECON-1010H - Intro to Microeconomics with a minimum grade of 60% ECON-1020H - Intro to

Macroeconomics with a minimum grade of 60%

ECON-1250H - Intro to Math (pre-requisite 60% or higher in ECON 1010H and 1020H)

### Level 2000 Required Courses (1.5 credits):

ECON 2000H - Intermediate Microeconomic Theory 1 (pre-requisite 60% or higher in ECON 1010H and 1020H as well as a passing grade in ECON 1250H)

ECON 2010H - Intermediate Macroeconomic Theory 1 (pre-requisite 60% or higher in ECON 1010H and 1020H)

ECON – 2200H – Intro to Statistics (pre-requisite 60% or higher in ECON 1010H and 1020H)

### Level 3000 Required Courses (3 credits):

ECON 3000H (pre-requisite ECON 2000H)

ECON 3010H (pre-requisite ECON 2010H)

ECON 3200H (pre-requisite ECON 2200H or equivalent and 2250H or equivalent. Pre- or co-requisite both ECON 2000H and 2010H or permission of the instructor)

ECON 3250H (pre-requisite ECON 2000H and 2010H)

0.5 ECON credit at the 3000 level or beyond

0.5 ECON credit at the 3000 level or beyond

# Level 4000 Required Courses (1.5 credit):

ECON 4000H (pre-requisite ECON 3000H, 2200H or equivalent and 1250H or equivalent)

ECON 4041H (open only to Honours Economics students with at least 14 university credits including ECON 2000H, 2010H, and 3200H)

ECON 4050H (pre-requisite ECON 3010H, 2200H or equivalent and 1250H or equivalent)

## **Additional Required Credits**

2.0 ECON credits in addition to the above

#### Notes:

- a) you need to meet the requirements for both your major and your degree
- b) degree requirements include:
  - 1. Maximum number of D credits is 1.0
  - 2. Need 0.5 INDG credit
  - 3. Maximum number of first year credits is 7.0
  - 4. Minimum number of third and four year credits is 7.0
  - 5. Minimum cumulative average of 65%
- c) you need to plan out your courses to make sure you have the pre-requisites
- d) full details for Economics can be found in the University calendar
- e) ECON 3200H and 3250H should be completed within first 14.0 credits
- f) HBSC is 14 science credits including 1.0 math credit (ECON 2200H and 3200H fulfill this requirement)
