WATER QUALITY CENTRE (Chemical Sciences Building F101)

- The Water Quality Centre (WQC) is a state-of-the art mass spectrometry facility that currently houses 16 mass spectrometers in a single lab. The WQC specializes in method development and the application of new and innovative techniques for measuring isotopes and trace amounts of organic and inorganic contaminants in water, as well as the analysis of biological material, sediments, soils, fly ash, municipal wastewaters, industrial by-products and process waters.
- The WQC is located in the Chemical Sciences Building, CSB F101. Please wait for an attendant to show you in, as there is a keypad entry system.

TRENT-FLEMING SCHOOL OF NURSING (DNA Building – East Bank)
