





Canada's first and only Indigenous Studies Ph.D. offers students a unique opportunity to pursue advanced research grounded in Indigenous knowledges, cultures and community. In this program, you will work closely with Elders and Knowledge Holders, leading your own projects while exploring traditional and contemporary approaches to Indigenous scholarship. With flexible dissertation options and hands-on learning, graduates become leaders in restoring, recognizing and advancing Indigenous knowledge systems across academic and community settings.

- Full-time studies (part-time is available after completing the Comprehensive Examinations and Dissertation Proposal Defence)
- The Ph.D. program has one field: Indigenous Knowledges: Peoples, Lands, Cultures. Students must indicate their area(s) of research when applying

- Students can also choose the Doctoral Cotutelle: complete residency and course requirements at Trent and another university outside Canada, producing only one dissertation but receiving two Ph.D.s


