Research Facilities & Centres

01 Trent Farm Research Centre

The Trent Farm Research Centre offers hands-on learning and research opportunities in climate-smart agriculture, connecting students with community, exploring sustainability, and bringing Indigenous and intergenerational knowledge into the work.

02 Water Quality Centre

Within Canada's most comprehensive water analysis laboratory, graduate students acquire hands-on experience with advanced mass spectrometry and gain access to top researchers and industry partners.

03 Financial Intelligence & Innovation Hub

With 12 Bloomberg terminals and direct access to global markets like the New York Stock Exchange, the Financial Intelligence & Innovation Hub gives students opportunities to put financial theory into practice and develop practical experience for careers in finance.

04 Frost Centre for Canadian & Indigenous Studies

Grounded in Trent's deep roots in Canadian and Indigenous Studies, the Frost Centre unites students and scholars across disciplines in a supportive, globally engaged academic community.

05 Library & Archives

Trent's Library & Archives gives graduate students access to archives and special collections, private study spaces, expert research and learning services, and specialized spaces in Bata Library like the Create Centre for Entrepreneurship, and Odette Critical Making Studio.

06 Forensic Crime Scene Facility

A first-of-its-kind in Canada, the Forensic Crime Scene Facility offers graduate students a 4,100 square-foot professional training facility with unique spaces and equipment that pioneer approaches to teach and explore forensic science methodology.

07 Trent Centre for Aging & Society

Work alongside faculty, researchers and community partners exploring the contemporary aging issues and practical approaches to aging-related challenges across different contexts.

	Master's Degrees • Research-Based Master's: Pursue original research through a thesis or major research paper while working closely with faculty mentors to develop advanced research skills and expertise. • Course-Based Master's: Build specialized knowledge through advanced coursework, with experiential learning opportunities such as paid co-ops, placements, or capstone projects.
	Graduate Diplomas • Expand your expertise through focused graduate-level study. Build specialized knowledge and professional skills in as little as 8 to 12 months.
	Pre-Master's Pathway • Designed for students who are close to meeting graduate admission requirements, the Pre-Master's pathway provides academic preparation and a direct path into the Management or Applied Modelling & Quantitative Methods course-based master's programs upon successful completion.

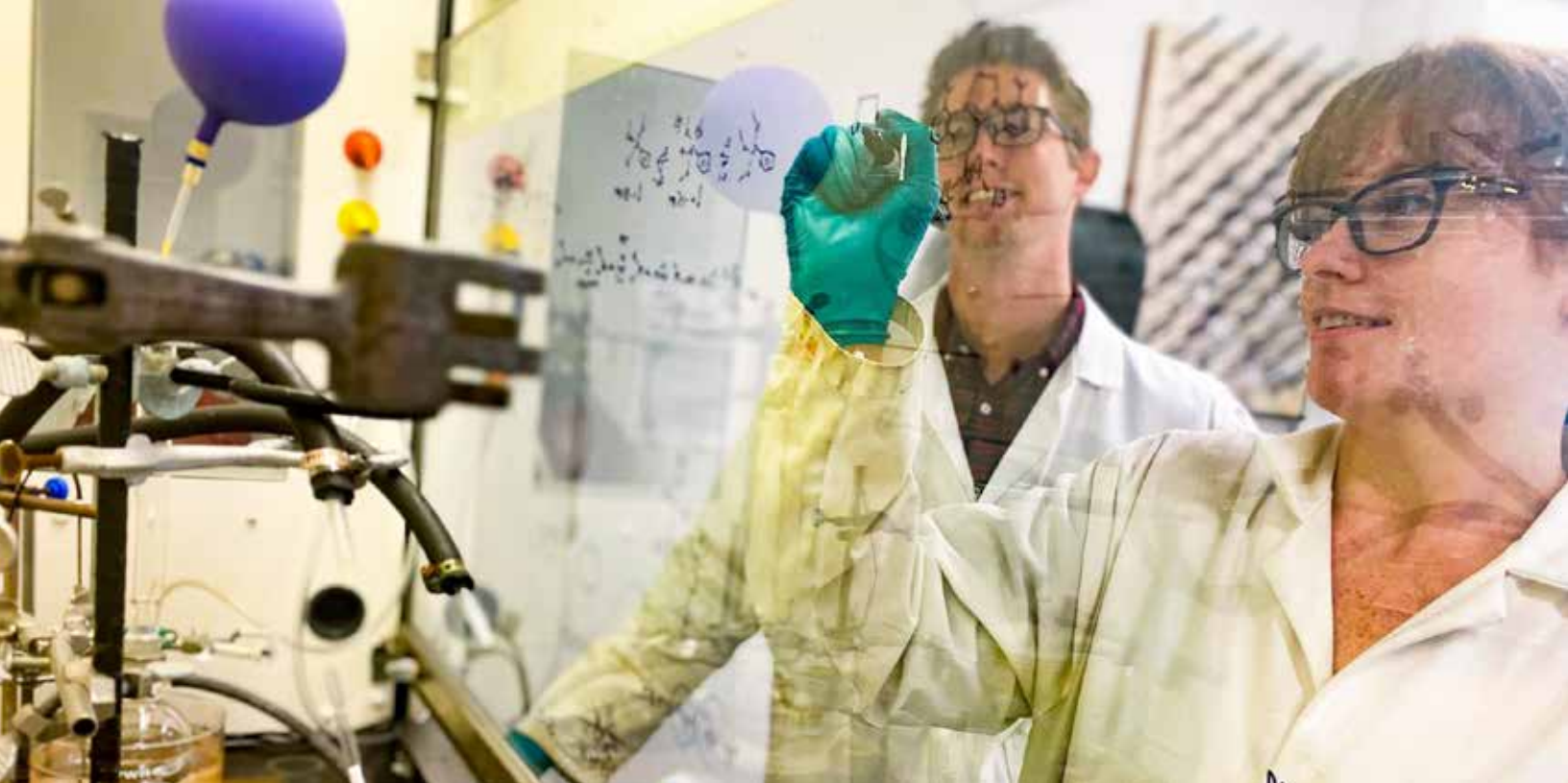
