- **DEVELOPING MINDS LAB:** Study how children learn about the world and investigate the cognitive and social processes that shape development.

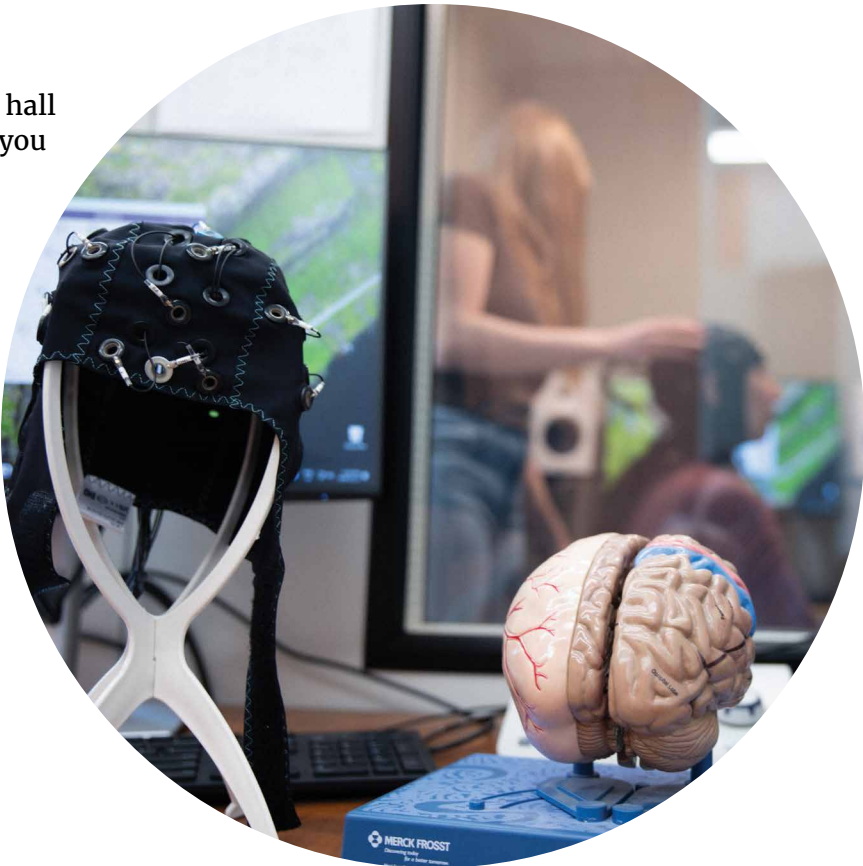

Bachelor of Science In Nursing: Collaborative Program

CAMPUS/LOCATION: Peterborough
LENGTH OF STUDY: 4 years*
DEGREE EARNED: Honours B.Sc.N.

Beginning in your first year, Trent Nursing students integrate theory and practice through lectures, seminars, case studies, simulation labs, online learning, and clinical experiences. As your knowledge grows, you will apply it in hospital and community settings while developing the skills needed for professional nursing practice.

LENGTH OF STUDY: 28 months
DEGREE EARNED: Honours B.Sc.N.
ENTRY FROM: college, university

If you are transferring from another university or are a graduate of an eligible Practical Nursing diploma program from Centennial, Fleming, Durham or Seneca College, the Compressed program allows you to complete your honours B.Sc.N. degree in just 28 months. This program features over 1,000 hours of clinical practice experience, weekly simulation labs, research and thesis options, and clinical placements across Ontario.

Bridge/Post-Bridge Program

CAMPUS/LOCATION: Toronto – George Brown Polytechnic
LENGTH OF STUDY: 1-year (bridge) + 2-year post-bridge (full-time or part-time)
DEGREE EARNED: Honours B.Sc.N.
ENTRY FROM: George Brown Polytechnic RPN Bridge Certificate Program

This Practical Nurse-to-B.Sc.N. pathway in partnership with George Brown Polytechnic allows graduates from a two-year Ontario Practical Nursing diploma program who are in good standing with the CNO to continue their education and earn an Honours B.Sc.N. through Trent. After completing the George Brown Bridge Certificate program, you will continue your studies with Trent faculty at George Brown’s Daphne Cockwell Centre for Health Sciences at their Waterfront Campus in downtown Toronto.

The Bridge/Post-Bridge program emphasizes interprofessional team-based education and provides access to a state-of-the-art nursing simulation hub. Students in this program will gain approximately 1,000 total hours of clinical placement and simulation experience.

Psychology (B.A. or B.Sc.) **Paid Co-op Available**

Kinesiology (B.Sc.Kin.) **Paid Co-op Available**

Study human movement, performance, and health while preparing for certification as a Registered Kinesiologist (R.Kin.). Through paid co-op and placement opportunities, you will connect classroom learning with professional experience.

- Complete the five-year co-op stream with 16 months of paid work experience.
- Choose the four-year placement pathway and learn alongside practitioners at facilities such as the Canadian Sport Institute Ontario, Coaching Association of Ontario, local sports clinics and camps, and Trent Health in Motion.

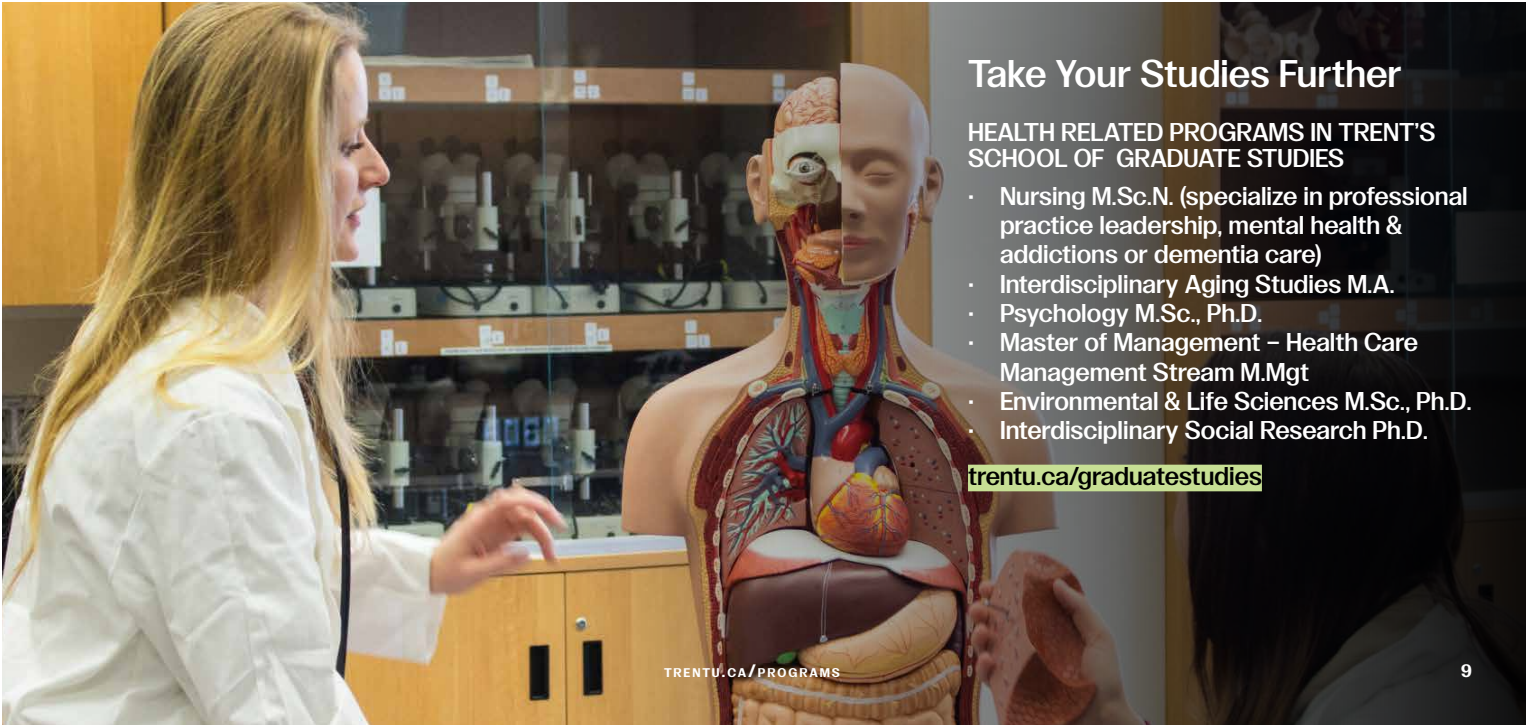

Admission Requirements for Compressed Program

Entry From College

- Minimum 75% average in a completed Practical Nursing diploma from a college including Centennial, Durham, Fleming and Seneca[†]
- Registered in good standing with the CNO[^]

Entry From University

- Minimum 70% average calculated on the last ten university full course equivalents (two years of an undergraduate degree program)

Prerequisites from University

- One semester of English (min. 60%), Biology (min. 60%), Chemistry (min. 60%), Math (min. 60%)*
- 1.0 full credit in an Introductory Psychology course**
- 2.0 full credits at the 1000 level (first year)
- 1.0 full credit at the 2000 level (second year)

For admission considerations, prerequisites must be completed within the last ten years.

Admission Requirements for R.P.N. Bridge to B.Sc.N.

R.P.N Bridge Certificate at George Brown

- Minimum 75% average in a completed Practical Nursing diploma from a recognized community college with no failed or repeated courses
- Registered in good standing with no practice restrictions with the College of Nurses of Ontario

Post-Bridge Requirements for Progression

- Minimum 75% average from successful completion of all Bridge certificate courses
- Minimum 70% in any course of the Bridge program for which transfer credits are granted

* Prerequisite requirements can be met through a combination of high school or post-secondary prerequisite courses

** For admission consideration, Intro to Psychology courses must have been completed within the past ten years. Applicants with sufficient upper year transfer credits may have this course requirement waived for admission.

[†] Practical Nursing graduates may be eligible for a block transfer of 5.0 full credits towards their B.Sc.N.

[^] The CNO registration requirement will be waived for graduates who have completed their PN program within the six months prior to admission at Trent.

Scholarships & Financial Support

Renewable Entrance Scholarships

Attention top scholars! Undergraduate students with an entering average of 95%+ are awarded full first-year tuition. Achieve an average of 80% or higher and you automatically receive an entrance scholarship – no application required. And it’s not just a one-time thing. Trent’s national entrance scholarships are RENEWABLE each year. When you maintain an 80% average each year, this can really pay off – with a total scholarship potential of \$18,000.
