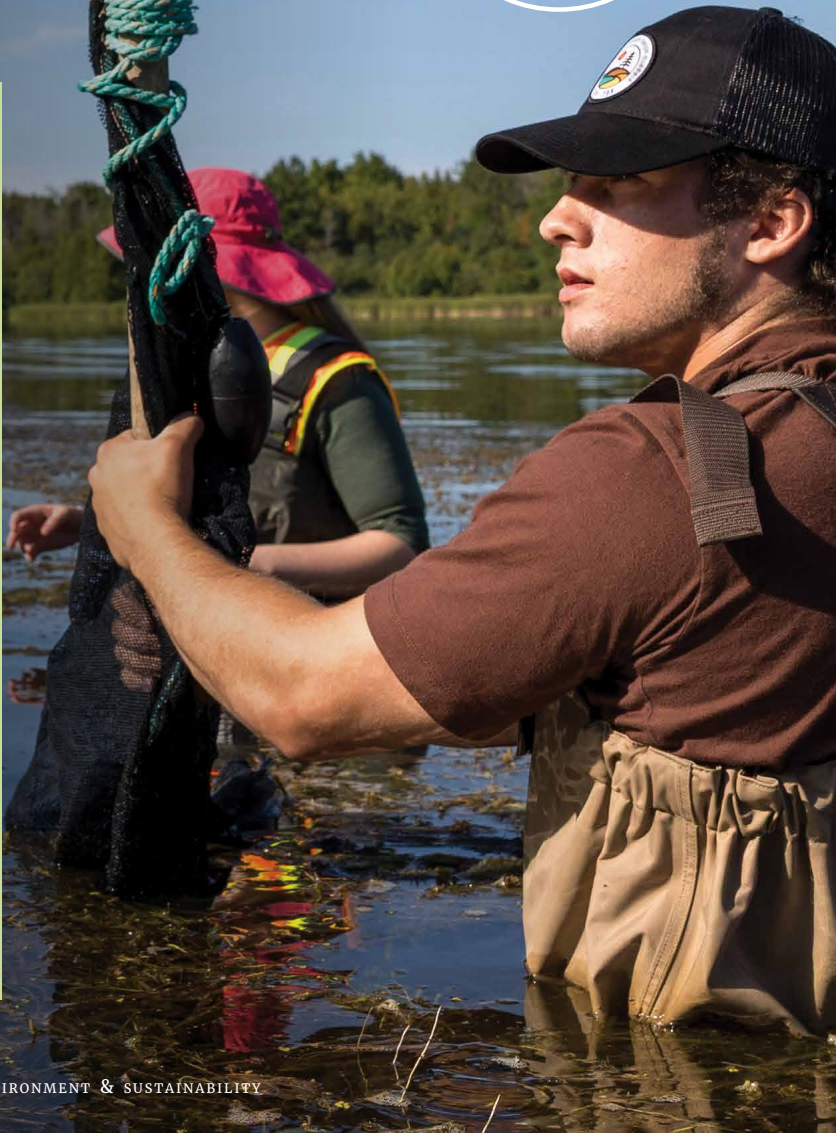

Peterborough is home to Ontario's MNRF provincial headquarters, and MNR researchers also work right on Trent's campus. Through shared facilities like the Natural Resources DNA Profiling & Forensic Centre, students can connect with leading-edge research in wildlife conservation and natural resource management.

ENVIRONMENTAL AND RELATED TECHNOLOGIES HUB (EaRTH) DISTRICT: As a partner in the Environmental and Related Technologies Hub (EaRTH District), Trent is connected to a powerful network of universities, colleges, industry, government and Indigenous communities working together on sustainable solutions. The partnership creates opportunities for collaborative research and innovation in clean energy technology and resilient communities.

NORTHERN AND RURAL INNOVATION CLUSTER: Through the Northern and Rural Innovation Cluster, Trent works alongside other Ontario universities to advance research and innovation for northern and rural communities. Together, the partners connect expertise, strengthen industry and government relationships, and create new opportunities for collaboration.

A Campus Built for Environmental Study & Discovery

Environmental learning at Trent extends far beyond the classroom. Our 1,400-acre campus, featuring 11 nature areas, provides nearly endless opportunities to study forests, wetlands, rivers, farms, and ecosystems firsthand. Combined with advanced research facilities, specialized learning spaces, and opportunities to learn and work alongside faculty and expert researchers, Trent offers an environmental learning experience that is difficult to match anywhere in Canada.

Trent Farm Research Centre

A hub for climate-smart agriculture, sustainable food systems, and environmental research, the Trent Farm Research Centre connects students with opportunities for research, employment, volunteering, and community engagement. The farm supports innovation in sustainable agriculture while supplying fresh seasonal food to the Trent community.

Water Quality Centre

Located within Trent’s Chemical Sciences Building, the Water Quality Centre houses one of the largest collections of mass spectrometers dedicated to environmental analysis in North America. Students and researchers use advanced analytical instruments to investigate water quality, aquatic ecosystems, environmental contaminants, and emerging environmental challenges while supporting projects with government, industry, and research partners.

Environmental Wind Tunnel

Located in Trent’s Environmental Sciences Building, this world-class research facility is a low-speed, open-loop wind tunnel designed for simulation of the atmospheric boundary layer both in clean air and with sediment transport. Located in a climate controlled lab, distinguished by its ability to perform low temperature and full humidity control simulations, the TEWT propels tonnes of sediment samples sent from across the globe, through the tunnel each year to study factors such as wind erosion, micro-plastic transportation, and particle tracking as examples.

Research that Changes the World

We’re developing innovative solutions in climate resilience, sustainable agriculture, freshwater health, and biodiversity, with a shared goal to improve lives and protect our planet.



Groundbreaking Research Projects

GROWING FOOD MORE SUSTAINABLY

TSE Professor Dr. Huy Dang’s research group is developing a new generation of fertilizers intended to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, preserve soil health, and strengthen crop productivity.

PROTECTING FRESHWATER ECOSYSTEMS

Funding from the Ministry of Natural Resources is supporting Trent-led projects with shared goals towards the health of freshwater by exploring genetics on brook trout in Lake Superior, measuring stress on our aquatic systems and investigating wildfire impact on boreal fish populations.

RESEARCH ROOTED IN INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE

Research through Trent’s Chanie Wenjack School for Indigenous Studies explores how climate change and environmental pressures affect Indigenous health, food security and access to traditional resources, particularly across Canada’s North.

GRADUATE RESEARCH ADVANCING CONSERVATION

Trent Ph.D. student Bradley Howell is using innovative acoustic tracking technology to uncover how fish interact with predators and their environments, helping inform conservation and management of freshwater ecosystems.

Achieve an average of 80% or higher and you automatically receive an entrance scholarship – no application required. And it’s not just a one-time thing. Trent’s national entrance scholarships are RENEWABLE each year. When you maintain an 80% average each year, this can really pay off – with a total scholarship potential of \$18,000.

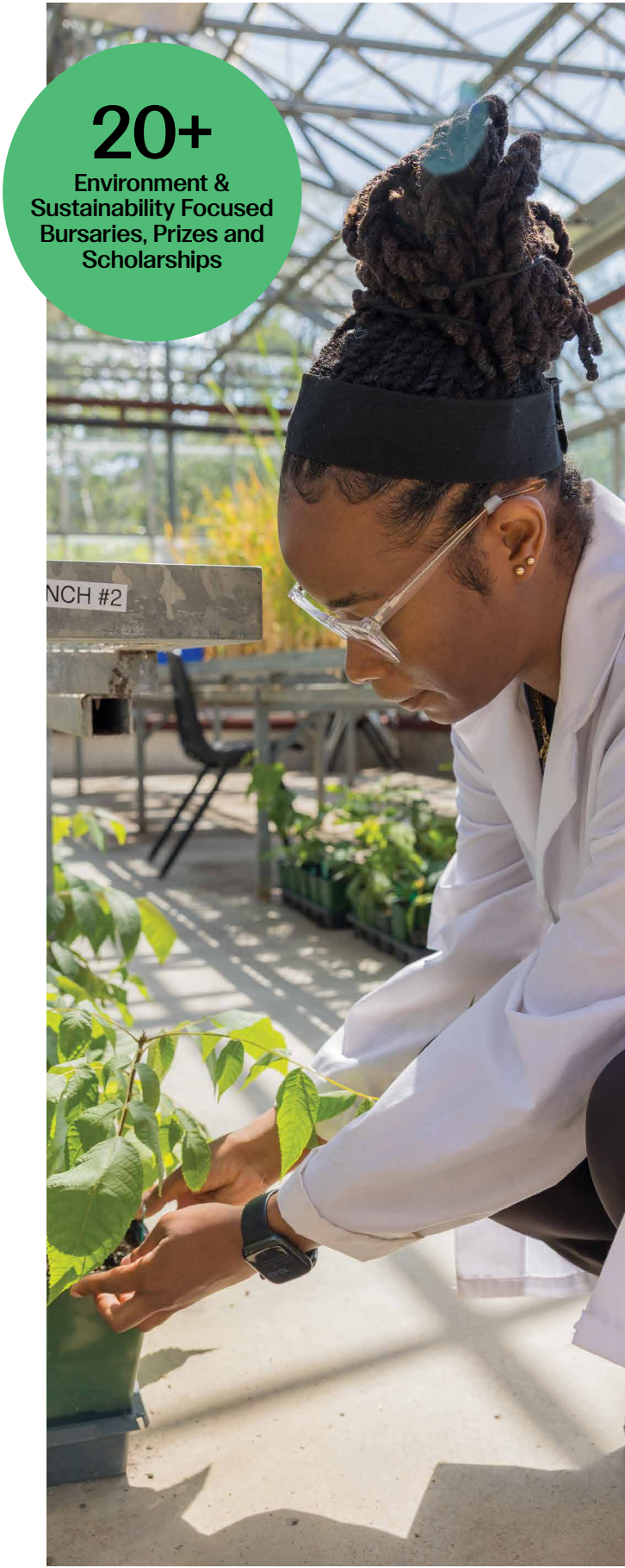
More Scholarships for Environment & Sustainability Students
