A HANDY LIST OF ACADEMIC TERMS

DEGREES: Also known as “Bachelor’s degree” or “undergraduate degree”, this is the first level of study at a university, often a three (general) or four year (honours) program that prepares you for your future profession or the next step of your academic career.

MAJOR: The primary area of study within a degree program, a major involves intensive focus on a particular discipline.

MINOR: An optional secondary field of study that can be related to or different from your major, a minor is usually selected after you begin your studies.

OPTIONS: Often referred to as “mini minors,” options are a prescribed set of courses in a discipline outside of your degree. These specific areas of study can be completed alongside almost any undergraduate degree program. A unique focus to your degree provides you with a distinct advantage in the career of your choice.

SPECIALIZATIONS: Distinguish your degree by adding a specialization and gain deeper understanding of your chosen discipline. Adding a specialization shows future employers or graduate schools that you’re focused and interested in becoming an expert in your field.

POST-GRADUATE CERTIFICATES:

These certificate programs are designed to complement the skills and knowledge acquired through the completion of an undergraduate degree to boost your professional skills for in-demand fields.

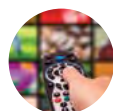

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS

The following minimum admission requirements do not guarantee entry to competitive programs as they normally require much higher grades.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)

Minimum overall score of 26 (including bonus points) in IB diploma. English Language A with a minimum grade of 4 satisfies English requirement. English B with a strong grade may also be accepted. Prerequisite courses can be presented at Standard and/or Higher Level.

For programs with required “Mathematics”, we will accept the following:

- Analysis and approaches (Math AA) – HL
- Analysis and approaches (Math AA) – SL
- Applications and interpretation (Math AI) – HL

Applications and interpretation (Math AI) – SL: will be accepted where “Mathematics” is recommended only.

For admission to Biomedical Science the following IB courses are required: Biology, Chemistry, English and one of Math or Physics.

IB Certificates

IB certificate courses (both Standard and Higher Level) can be used for admission only in conjunction with another high school curriculum.

IB Career Related Program

Applications are accepted on a case by case basis.

Advanced Standing (transfer credits):

HL courses completed with a grade of 5 and higher qualify for transfer credits.

BRITISH-PATTERNED EDUCATION

Minimum ‘C’ grade in five O-level (IGCSE) subjects and two A-level (A2) subjects. Two AS subjects may be substituted for one A2 subject. A grade of C in O-level English satisfies English requirement.

BTEC Diploma

Applications are accepted on a case by case basis.

Advanced Standing (transfer credits):

A2 courses completed with a grade of C or higher qualify for transfer credits.

AMERICAN-PATTERNED EDUCATION

Minimum ‘B’ average (3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale) in a recognized academic grade 12 program with at least four different senior level academic subjects. A minimum grade of 70% in English 12 satisfies English requirement.

Advanced Standing (transfer credits):

AP courses with grade of 4 or higher qualify for transfer credits.

ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL DIPLOMA

Minimum 70% average in best six 4U/M courses. Each applicant is reviewed on an individual basis for meeting English requirement.

INDIA SENIOR SCHOOL CERTIFICATE

Standard X Certificate results plus a minimum 70% average in Standard XII in best 4 academic courses, including English. English proficiency test results will be likely required.

Commerce stream students in India Senior High School are exempt from

having Mathematics as a required course for admission to Bachelor of Business Administration program.

CHINA SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

Minimum 75% average in Senior 3 (only academic courses are taken into average calculation). English proficiency test results are normally required for direct admission to undergraduate studies. Apply through Trent-ESL: English for University if you do not possess/meet published English proficiency requirements.

VIETNAM UPPER SECONDARY SCHOOL DIPLOMA

Minimum 7.0 average in Grade 12 (only academic courses are taken into average calculation). English proficiency results are normally required for direct admission to undergraduate studies. Apply through Trent-ESL: English for University if you do not possess/ meet published English proficiency requirements.

THE WEST AFRICAN SENIOR SCHOOL CERTIFICATE

Minimum B3 average in five best academic courses. A minimum grade of B3 in English Language is required and satisfies English requirement.

University Health Insurance Plan

When you come to study or work at an Ontario university, you must have insurance to pay the cost of health care services and medical treatments. The University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP) is a mandatory health plan for all international non-residents studying or working at a participating university or affiliated college in Ontario.

UHIP applies to: international students studying in Ontario; international employees working in Ontario who do not have OHIP; dependents (legal spouse and children) of international students and employees who are not eligible for OHIP; non-Ontario residents who do not have OHIP; short-term international visitors associated with a participating university.

UHIP provides coverage for basic medical services and treatments you and your eligible dependents might need to maintain your health while living in Canada.

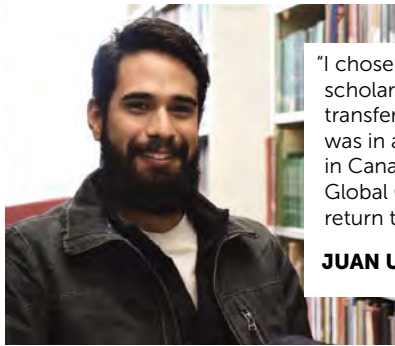

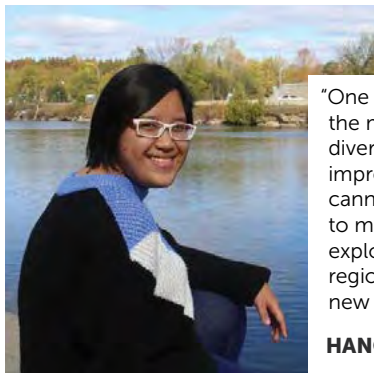

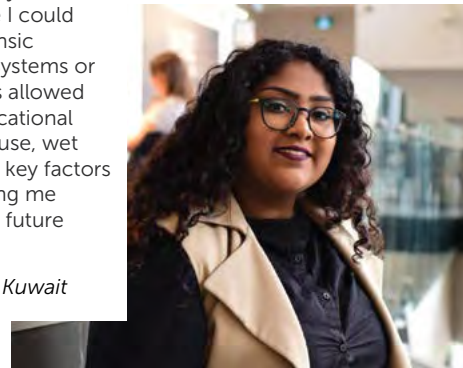
