At the frontlines of healthcare, nurses are figures of wellness, support, and strength. At Trent, we emphasize a well-rounded approach to healthcare and will prepare you for success whether you want to work in a hospital setting or somewhere less traditional. Beginning in year one, you will be immersed in both theory and practice through lectures, seminars, case studies, simulation labs, online coursework, and clinical practice. You will not only develop the important skills necessary for nursing, you'll also have the opportunity to practice what you've learned through a range of hospital and community placement settings.

#### **The Trent Advantage**

Develop a strong understanding of social justice and political advocacy in the healthcare environment by choosing courses with topics ranging from aging, mental health, Indigenous communities, rural, and women's health. You will take courses in the five foci to deepen your knowledge in these areas.

#### **Admission Requirements**

#### **Applying from High School**

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD); Completed prerequisite course equivalents: ENG4U (min. 70%), SBI4U (min. 70%), SCH4U (min. 70%), and any 4U Math (min. 70%); A minimum average of 75% calculated on the required courses, plus your next best two 4U/M courses; CASPer online assessment

#### **Applying from College**

Two semesters of English (min. 70% each), Biology (min. 65% each), Chemistry (min. 65% each), and Math (min. 65% each); A minimum average of 75% (3.0 GPA) in a completed pre-health science (university stream) certificate program OR two semesters of a diploma program at a recognized college; CASPer online assessment

#### **Applying from University**

One semester of English (min. 60%), Biology (min. 60%), Chemistry (min. 60%), and Math (min. 60%); A minimum average of 70% (2.7 GPA) calculated on the equivalent of two years or less of study; Applicants with more than two years of undergraduate study are encouraged to apply to the Compressed stream; CASPer online assessment

#### A NOTE ABOUT CASPER

## Now an admissions requirement for all Nursing programs

Don't let the word "test" make you nervous. You have nothing to be afraid of. In fact, you don't even have to study for this test! CASPer is a 90-minute online assessment of personal traits suitable for the nursing profession such as ethics, empathy, and judgement. All applicants to programs in the Trent/Fleming School of Nursing are required to complete the CASPer test as part of their application to the program. This requirement works in your favour by increasing equity in the application process to provide a holistic view of applicants, going beyond book smarts to objectively understand the personal traits you possess that will make you a great nurse, including professionalism, ethics and communication skills.

Did you know in both our collaborative and compressed B.Sc.N programs you have the option of heading to Central America as part of a community health brigade in your second year? This 12-day placement in either Honduras or Guatemala will give you the opportunity to support primary healthcare needs in both urban and rural settings and provide important education on topics such as sexual health, family planning, gender equality, nutrition, dental care and clean water access. Install and maintain clean water filters; help develop community gardens; or complete small construction projects to aid and assist communities in healthy daily living. Trent nursing students have done it all.

#### FAST TRACK YOUR NURSING DEGREE

Already have some credits that can be transferred toward your nursing degree? This compressed program will take you from the classroom to the nursing career of your dreams even faster. If you are a recent graduate from Fleming College's Practical Nursing diploma or are transferring from another university, this program follows the same curriculum as the collaborative program, but allows you to graduate with an Honours degree in Nursing (B.Sc.N.) in just 28 months.



Study in Trent's renowned nursing program with the added benefit of applying previous credits earned — we recognize your hard work. You will also have the option to do research and complete an undergraduate thesis in your final two semesters.

#### **Resumé Boosters**

- Get career experience beyond the traditional hospital setting by presenting original work at regional health conferences or by participating in health projects in the community

#### **Admission Requirements**

#### **Applying from College**


Recent graduates from the Fleming College Practical Nursing diploma program who are registered in good standing with the CNO, will be considered for admission with a minimum GPA of 3.0 (75%) and are eligible for a block transfer of 5.0 full credits; CASPer online assessment

#### **Transferring from Another University**

Secondary school 4U or college prerequisite courses as listed for the Collaborative program, or one semester of: Biology (min. 60%), Chemistry (min. 60%), Math (min. 60%), 1.0 full credit in an Introductory Psychology course\*, 2.0 full credits at the 1000 level (first year), 1.0 full credit at the 2000 level (second year); A minimum GPA of 2.7 (70%) calculated on the last ten (10) university full course equivalents (two years of an undergraduate degree program); CASPer online assessment

\* For admission consideration Intro to Psychology courses must have been completed within the past 10 years. Applicants with sufficient additional transfer credits may have this course requirement waived for admission.





### POST-BRIDGE P.N. TO B.Sc.N. PATHWAY

#### Start the Next Chapter of Your Nursing Career

Looking for a career upgrade? Our P.N. Bridge to B.Sc.N. program with George Brown College allows graduates from any two-year college Practical Nursing (P.N.) diploma program who are registered in good standing with the College of Nurses of Ontario to upgrade their qualifications. Upon completion of the Bridge program, you'll enter the Trent B.Sc.N. program, to become eligible to write the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) for RNs.

- Located at George Brown College's striking waterfront campus in downtown Toronto with access to clinical placements in the GTA in a variety of settings
- Entrance scholarships for students transferring from the George Brown Bridge certificate




#### **Admission Requirements**

The P.N. Bridge to B.Sc.N. program is open to graduates from any recognized community college Practical Nursing (P.N.) diploma program who are registered in good standing with the College of Nurses of Ontario

- Candidates must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (75%) and not less than 70% in certain Practical Nursing diploma courses to be considered for admission to the Bridge program
- Students who successfully complete all bridging courses through George Brown and have a minimum cumulative average of 75% and not less than 70% in certain bridge certificate courses will be eligible for admission to Trent's Bachelor Science in Nursing program, offered at the George Brown campus
- CASPer online assessment

# DIPLOMA IN FOUNDATIONS OF INDIGENOUS LEARNING FOR FUTURE NURSING STUDENTS

#### Bringing together Indigenous knowledge and Western healthcare

For more than 50 years Trent has incorporated traditional teachings and perspectives in and out of the classroom. Our Diploma in Foundations of Indigenous Learning for Future Nursing Students is your perfect fit if you are a student of Indigenous heritage who is looking for a supportive environment to make the transition into university level studies. This unique bridge program is the only one of its kind in Ontario, and gives you the opportunity to earn the credits toward qualifying for entry into our compressed nursing program and begin your nursing career.

#### **Admission Requirements**

To bridge from this diploma program into the compressed Nursing program, you must meet the following requirements: Successful completion of the Diploma in Foundations of Indigenous Learning with a minimum cumulative average of 70% and a minimum 60% in each course (including PSYC 1020H and PSYC 1030H, as well as courses in Mathematics, Chemistry, and/or Biology if not previously taken as 4U secondary school credits). Fulfillment of admissions criteria for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing compressed program.

# Build on your experience as a Registered Nurse, support your community (and beyond) with expertise in mental health and addiction

Trent's new Graduate Diploma in Mental Health and Addictions Nursing is the first of its kind in Ontario and allows you to complement your career and lifestyle in pursuing specialized knowledge in this high-demand nursing field. The five-course program of study is delivered over five semesters through online coursework and on-site practicum workshops. Our active learning program incorporates two eight-hour workshops focused on doing rather than listening with activities including role play and simulated practice in addition to more traditional learning The final course of this diploma program offers experiential education in the form of a peer mentored clinical practicum.


