

Pre-Master's Pathway:

New for Fall 2026 applicants to AMOD & MGT course-based streams.

Receive automatic consideration for a 1yr upgrade stream if you have a 70% or 3-year Bachelor degree. Those who complete the program with a 77% will progress into the Master's program they applied to.

Accelerated Master's:

- Programs: Environmental and Life Sciences (MSc), History (MA), English Public Texts (MA), Cultural Studies (MA)
- How it Works: If you're a high achiever in your 3rd year at Trent, the
 Accelerated Master's allows Trent undergrads to work towards
 advanced standing in a Master's with the potential to complete in 12 20 months. Once accepted, in 4th year, you take a graduate level
 course as an undergraduate elective
- If interested, connect with potential supervisors in your third year to determine a research pathway, and then contact the program directly for application information

Tuition & Finances



Graduate Tuition & Funding



Fees vary between research/thesis-based programs and course-based programs

 Range of compulsory and full-time international tuition & fees for 12-month (3-terms) 2025-2026 academic year is \$25,615 to \$55,255 depending on program/stream selection

Some programs require a deposit upon acceptance which ranges from \$500-\$2,500

Funding is automatically provided as part of the offer letter for eligible students in **research programs**. No application is required

- Guaranteed funding for eligible students at the Masters level could be: \$16,000 to \$21,000 CAD per year for 1 – 2 years (*Excludes Master in Educational Studies, Master of Science in Forensic Science, Master in Science in Nursing)
- Guaranteed funding for eligible students at the Ph.D. level could be: \$21,000 to \$25,000 CAD per year for 4 years

Professional programs do not offer funding. Students in these programs are expected to be able to pay the full cost of their studies



Special Scholarship Offer:

Top scholar applicants to course-based Master of Management or Applied Modelling streams may be awarded a Graduate Distinguished Entrance Scholarship of up to \$3,000 based on academic excellence. No application is required

Scholarships & Bursaries



- There are many sources of funding outside of those provided by Trent, including:
 - Tri Council Scholarships
 - Canada Graduate Scholarships
 - Mackenzie King Scholarship
 - Vanier Canada Graduate Scholarships
 - Ontario Graduate Scholarship (OGS)
- Graduate students are encouraged to research and apply for multiple external awards. Visit our "Scholarships and Awards" page to start your search
- Winning graduate scholarships takes practice. Our team supports hosts a series of workshops throughout the year to help guide students through scholarship processes and develop winning applications. Available workshops are listed on our "How to Win Scholarships" page on our Financial Matters site
- Trent also offers a bursary program. Bursaries are awarded each term to students with demonstrated financial need. Bursaries are meant to supplement, not replace, provincial government aid programs and a student's own resources. The application is available at the beginning of each term. To be considered, students must submit a completed application online by the advertised deadline.



The Application Process



Applying to Graduate School: Intakes



Fall term - September 1

- Almost all programs offer a Fall intake
- For many this is the only intake offered for their program
- Official deadline to apply is Feb 1st for most programs
- Some have unique earlier or later deadlines. Check program admission sites for details.

Winter term – January 1

- Select programs only
- Deadline to apply is June 1st

Spring term – May 1

- Select programs only
- Deadline to apply is October 1st

How to Apply Step 1: Check Admission Requirements



General Requirements:

Master's: Equivalent of Canadian 4-year Bachelor's degree

Doctorate: Equivalent of Canadian Master's degree

Minimum B+ (77%) Ontario equivalent in the last two years of full-time

study

Note: Individual programs may require higher entrance averages or have additional admission criteria

International Requirements:

Acceptable proof of English Proficiency:

- CAEL or CAEL online (min. Overall score 60)
- IELTS (Academic) (min. Overall score 6.5, no band below 6.0)
- TOEFL iBT (min overall 93, 22 in speaking & writing)

Applicants must review program specific requirements prior to applying

 - For all post-secondary institutions attended
- 2. Two letters of Reference
 - a) Academic references are preferred but professional references will be accepted
- 3. Plan of Study or Personal Statement
- 4. Writing Sample

- Proof of English proficiency (International)
- 7. Confirmed Supervisor (Research Programs)

ational Required Application Documents

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Honours degree (a four-year undergraduate bachelor's degree)
- Minimum B+ (77%) or equivalent in the last two years of full-time study, or last ten full
 academic credits
- Familiarity with calculus is highly desirable for any potential applicants. Successful
 completion of an undergraduate quantitative methods course will prove to be very helpful
 for students wishing to apply to this program
- Proof of English Proficiency: All international applicants must provide proof of an adequate level of English proficiency regardless of their citizenship status or country of origin. Please visit our <u>How to Apply: International</u> page for details on English Language Proficiency requirements
- A GRE test score is not required for admission into this program

International

Required Application Documents

ALL APPLICANTS, DOMESTIC AND INTERNATIONAL, MUST SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS TO COMPLETE THEIR APPLICATION:

- Transcripts: Unofficial copies of all post-secondary transcripts
- Plan of Study/Personal Statement: 1-2 pages outlining your objectives in a graduate program. Any specific research interests, relevant experiences, and/or career aspirations can be included
- Writing Sample: A sample of your writing of about 20 pages or less. The preferred submission format is PDF. Good choices for writing samples include: an undergraduate essay, lab report, research report, journal article, a chapter from a masters thesis, or a published article.
- Detailed Resume or Curriculum Vitae
- . Proof of Citizenship (ie. copy of passport or birth certificate)

Securing a Supervisor (if applicable)



- Supervisors are required or recommended for most research programs at the Master's and Ph.D. levels.
- Applicants are responsible for selecting their own research topic and seeking out a potential supervisor.
- Applicants should review our <u>"Finding a Supervisor"</u> section on our Future Students site for advice on contacting, meeting and securing potential supervisors
- Contact faculty early before applying. Tell them:
 - Why you are writing to them and ask if they are they accepting any graduate students
 - Describe who you are, what your research passions are, and why you feel they would be a good fit for your research



Check out the program's website, where you will find more information about the experience offered in each program.

Faculty & Research page are great places to begin reviewing potential supervisory matches for your work

How to Apply Step 2: Submit OUAC Application

- Applications are only accepted online via OUAC
- You can access the link to apply on our "Future Students" page which outlines steps to apply for both domestic and international applicants
- A "frequently asked questions" section is also provided with answers to most common questions applicants ask during the application stage

Each "How to Apply" page, domestic and international, includes detailed steps that you will need to take to complete your application



The OUAC Portal





Clicking the orange "Apply Now" button leads to the OUAC site. You will need to create an Account using a unique email (takes approx. 1 hour to complete)



- Choose your program(s) and complete the application by filling in required sections. Application fee is \$125 for research programs, \$140 for professional programs, \$110 for M.Sc.N.
- Fee is applied for each program choice (not application), but you can apply and pay for 2 within the same application

How to Apply Step 3: Activate MyTrent & Upload Documents



- After completing their OUAC app, applicants will receive an email with their Trent ID and instructions to activate their myTrent account
- Following activation, upload all required documents using the MyTrent portal under the Grad Upload tab (cloud icon) within 30 days
- All post-secondary unofficial transcripts and grade scales are required
- Don't upload the same document more than once. You can upload single documents at a time
- Documents cannot be deleted once uploaded make sure to review what you are submitting before hand
- Only complete files will be reviewed by graduate programs for admission. Your status will change to "Pending Decision" when all documents are uploaded and your file is under review
- Applicants can also authorize an agent or family member in the MyTrent portal to have permission to contact us

How to Apply Step 4: Admission Decisions



- Admission decisions are made by individual graduate programs. Decision times vary
 Generally, decisions are sent 1-2 months after the application close date
- Admission Decisions are sent to applicants' OUAC email address only.
 Applicants should check this email regularly as well as their junk folder
- Admission decisions are final and cannot be appealed
- Applicants to notify <u>graduateadmissions@trentu.ca</u> of their intentions to accept/decline an offer within the timeline specified on the offer letter (usually 21-30 days)
- Most offers are conditional upon receiving official transcripts and proof of degree completion. Documents must be mailed in hard copy format from the issuing institution in a sealed and stamped envelope
 - Official copies acceptable. Do not submit original documents as they cannot be returned
- Tuition deposits required for all professional programs by dates listed in offer letters
