Knowledge Mobilization

Knowledge mobilization is about ensuring that all citizens benefit from publicly funded research. It is an umbrella term encompassing a wide range of activities relating to the production and use of research results, including knowledge synthesis, dissemination, transfer, exchange, and co-creation or co-production by researchers and knowledge users.

See SSHRC's definition of knowledge mobilization.

Examples include:

- publications such as journal articles, books and reports;
- events such as workshops and conferences;
- teaching curricula development or improvement; and
- knowledge transfer, synthesis, exchange and co-creation.

SSHRC's <u>Guidelines for Effective Knowledge Mobilization</u> help applicants and award holders incorporate knowledge mobilization activities into their tri-council-funded research, to maximize the impact of research.

Whenever possible, research results should be made available to the public through websites, databases, or institutional repositories in accordance with SSHRC's <u>Open Access</u> policy.

SSHRC:

- <u>funds activities</u> that allow researchers to communicate their results to the world;
- supports <u>research partnerships</u> that facilitate the co-creation and use of knowledge beyond the academic world; and
- develops <u>networks</u>, tools and best practices in the areas of knowledge-sharing and knowledge mobilization.
