Trent University School of Education and Professional Learning invites applications for a twelve-month limited-term appointment (LTA) with a start date of August 1, 2023. The position is subject to final budgetary approval. Successful candidates will provide leadership in practicum course curricula (Primary/Junior & Intermediate/Senior). Ability to contribute to educational law and cultural and linguistic diversity courses an asset. Teaching duties to be agreed with the Dean. The successful candidate will also serve as a Faculty Advisor.

The School of Education seeks applicants with strong scholarship and demonstrated excellence in teaching (at the primary/junior and intermediate/senior and/or university level). A completed Ph.D. in Education or closely related discipline is preferred. We welcome applicants who are committed to an integrative approach and to a vision of teaching and learning guided by ecological and social justice.

Trent University is situated on the banks of the Otonabee River in Peterborough, Ontario, Canada, and is surrounded by natural beauty. The School of Education and Professional Learning has a program well-known for its high quality and rigour including emphasis in literacies, issues of environmental and social justice, infusion of educational technologies, Indigenous studies, and discipline-specific excellence. All applications should include a letter of introduction which identifies the position applied for, current curriculum vitae, teaching philosophy, evidence of teaching success including teaching evaluations (preferably tabulated as well as anecdotal), demonstrated experience with current knowledge and practices of assessment and evaluation; description of current research interests and projects, and the names and full mailing/emailing addresses of three referees.
