

Trent University invites applications from qualified bioanthropologists or bioarchaeologists for a twelve month limited term appointment in the Department of Anthropology at the rank of Assistant Professor, commencing August 15, 2019 to August 14, 2020. This position is subject to final budgetary approval and the successful candidate will teach courses over the fall and winter terms.

Candidates must hold a Ph.D. in anthropology, archaeology, or a closely related field, and have a record of university teaching, research and publication in bioarchaeology or bioanthropology, including human osteology and paleopathology. The successful candidate's teaching load is two courses in the Fall term and four courses in the Winter term. Courses to be taught include ANTH/BIOL/FRSC-3404H Human Osteology (FA), ANTH-3540H Mortuary Archaeology (FA), ANTH-2123H Archaeology II: Methods (WI), ANTH-2450H Plagues and People (WI), ANTH/FRSC-3405H Forensic Anthropology (WI), and ANTH-4420H Paleopathology (WI).
