The School of Education seeks applicants with strong scholarship and demonstrated excellence in Indigenous Knowledge, pedagogies and ways of knowing (at the primary/junior, intermediate/senior and/or university levels). A completed Ph.D. in Indigenous Education or closely related discipline is preferred, but consideration may be given to those who hold a master's degree or professional equivalent. We welcome applicants who are committed to an integrative approach and to a vision of teaching and learning guided by ecological and social justice.
