



Policing & Community Well-being

Trent University Durham GTA invites applications for a three-year Limited term position as Coordinator of the Policing & Community Well-being Program at the rank of Assistant Professor with a start date of July 1, 2020. Please note that this position is subject to budgetary approval.

The successful candidate will coordinate the program and be able to teach a range of undergraduate level courses in Policing & Community Well-being. Candidates must have a demonstrated record of teaching excellence, have a strong ability to integrate both theory and practice through effective communication and presentation skills, stimulate and challenge the intellectual capacity of students, communicate effectively, and show demonstrated expertise in the study of policing and community well-being through a history of teaching and/or publishing in this area. Experience and demonstrated commitment to excellent pedagogical practices and a demonstrated interest in scholarly activity are also required. The successful applicant will be expected to actively promote this new program, work on developing new courses as well as engaging in research related to Policing & Community Well-being.

Candidates are expected to have a completed PhD degree with preference given to those who also have field experience as a serving police officer. Candidates without a PhD, or who are ABD will be appointed at the Lecturer level. The successful applicant should have experience in course development and be committed to a vision of Policing & Community Well-being that is centred around social justice issues.
