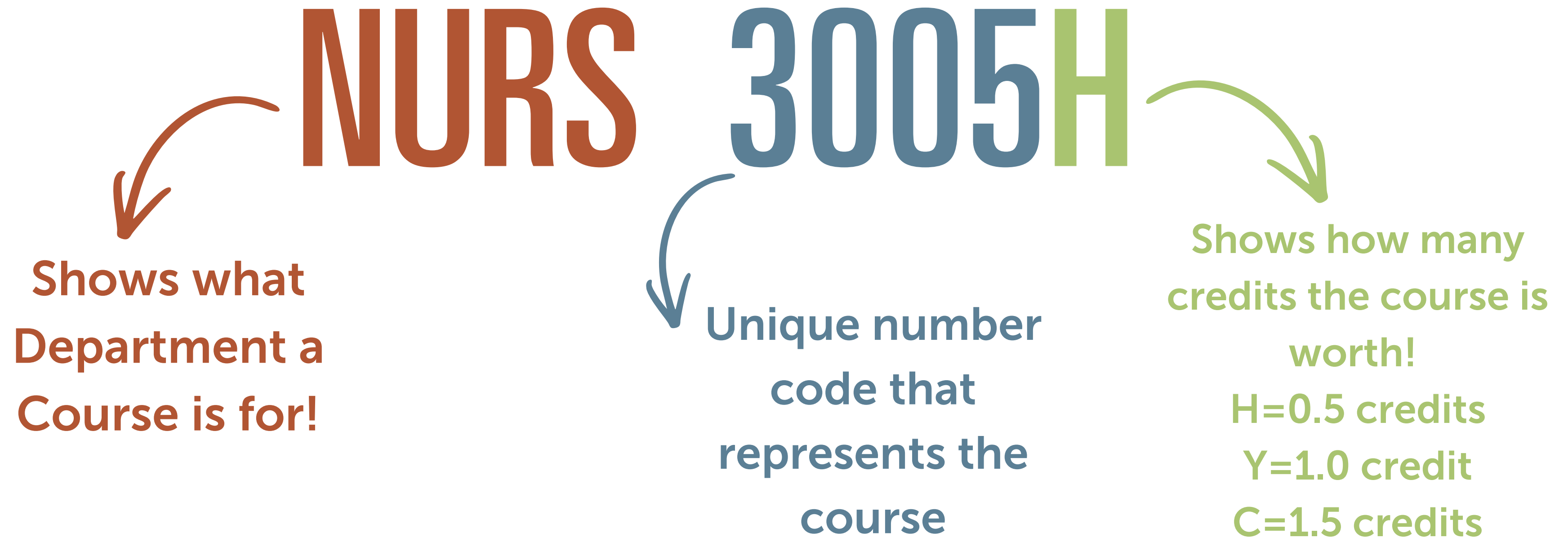

Registration Tips

- **Use your Program Map as a guide when planning your schedule in Self-Service**
- **Remember: Adding a course to your plan does not register you in the course**
- **On your registration day a blue “Register” button will appear next to your course and “register Now” at the top of the screen**
 - **“Register Now” MUST be used for any term that you are in a clinical course with a co-requisite theory**

Academic Requirements

- **65% cumulative average required for graduation**
- **Minimum 60% in all required courses**
- **Maximum of 1 repeated NURS theory course**
- **Maximum of 1 repeated NURS clinical course**
- **Maximum of 1.5 failed credits**

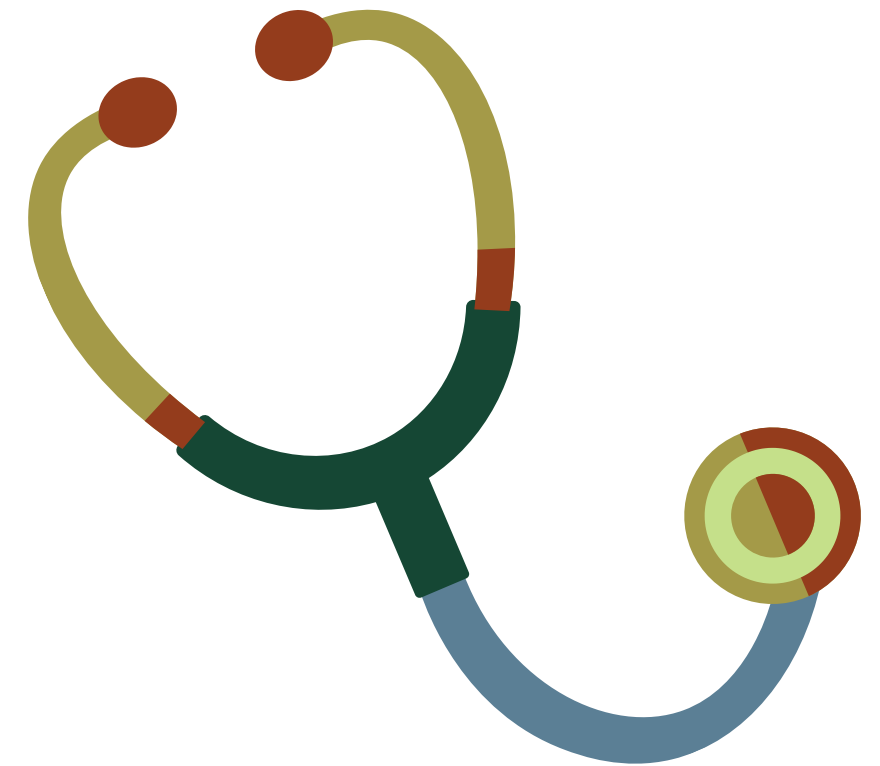
