How much bursary assistance to expect: Bursaries are meant to supplement Government student aid funding, and the resources provided by students, their parents and spouses. Bursaries are intended to cover a student's deficit in current educational expenses; they are not meant to address prior expenses or fully fund a student's entire deficit.

Allowable Expenses: Allowable expenses include all direct educational costs, including tuition, books, and living expenses. The Financial Aid office maintains a list of reasonable living and education costs, based on costs allowed by OSAP. Transportation costs could include bus or train costs, or costs for gasoline. Expenses related to vehicle purchases, leases, insurance or maintenance will NOT be considered for bursaries.

Student Resources: Students must declare all resources, including taxable and non-taxable income, when applying for a bursary. This includes, but is not limited to, money received from parents, scholarships, awards, and employment earnings. All student resources and parental contributions will be compared against the student's current OSAP application or the assessment notice from the financial aid of another province.
