Prestigious Scholarships

Students must apply for these scholarships. The application opens at the beginning of January through the myTrent applicant portal under the FINANCES tab. Deadline to apply is April 1.

» Champlain Scholarship

Awarded to entering students of exceptionally high academic achievement and promise. This scholarship is renewed in each of the succeeding three years of study providing that an academic average of at least 80% is maintained in five Trent University credits in each academic year. Value of scholarship is \$5,000.

» Michael Treadwell Scholarship

Established in 2000 to honour the late Professor Michael Treadwell, one of the earliest members of Trent University's Department of English Literature, a noted scholar and bibliographer in the field of seventeenth- and eighteenth-century English literature, and a devoted friend to his many undergraduate students. Awarded every four years to an entering student of exceptionally high academic achievement and promise intending to major in the humanities. This scholarship is renewed in each of the succeeding three years of study providing that an academic average of at least 80% is maintained in five Trent University credits in each academic year. Value of scholarship is \$4,500. Awarded for the first time for the 2005–2006 academic year and at four-year intervals thereafter. The winner will be selected by the Department of English Literature. This scholarship will be next offered to students entering in the September 2025 academic year.

» Board of Governors' Leadership Scholarship

Each year one scholarship is awarded to an entering student who has shown outstanding leadership and involvement in his/her community, as well as academic achievement. This scholarship is renewed in each of the succeeding three years of study providing that an academic average of at least 80% is maintained in five Trent University credits in each academic year. Value of scholarship is \$4,500.

» Trent University Special Admission Scholarship

Awarded to entering students of outstanding academic and extra-curricular achievement. This scholarship is renewed in each of the succeeding three years of study providing that an academic average of at least 80% is maintained in five Trent University credits in each academic year. Value of scholarship is \$3,750.

» Canada-Wide Science Fair Scholarship

Awarded to an entering student of outstanding academic and extra-curricular achievement who has been awarded a medal or honourable mention for a senior-level project at a Canada-Wide science fair within the past two calendar years. Students must provide proof of achievement at the Canada-Wide science fair. This scholarship is renewed in each of the succeeding three years of study providing that an academic average of at least 80% is maintained in five Trent University credits in each academic year. Value of scholarship is \$3,750.

Endowed In-Course and Entrance Scholarships

Listed below are endowed scholarships awarded to Trent students for academic excellence. These scholarships may be awarded as entrance, in-course, or scholarship renewals. Unless specifically noted, the scholarships do not require an application. See trentu.ca/studentfinances/scholarships-awards-bursaries for further details.

» Robert Annett Scholarships

There are two scholarships named in honour of Professor Robert G. Annett, who taught Biochemistry at Trent University 1968–1998 and was master of Otonabee College 1994–1998. His compassion and selflessness endeared him to colleagues, students, and staff. These scholarships, gifts of the Annett family, friends, and alumni, are normally awarded to an Otonabee College student majoring in Chemistry, preferably Biochemistry.

» Bill Armstrong Scholarship

A gift from Daryl Bennett in memory of William (Bill) Armstrong of Orono. Awarded annually, on the recommendation of the coordinator of the Northern and Polar Studies program, to a student of high achievement and promise entering the final year Honours program with a demonstrated interest and commitment in Northern Studies.

» Association Of Progressive Muslims Of Canada (APMC) Scholarship

To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student enrolled in Philosophy courses and working towards their first degree. Based upon a minimum average of 80% and the best essay or project submission reflecting the importance of promoting peace, justice, understanding, or equality.

» Clair Bailey Scholarship in Language and Literacy Education

A founding faculty member of the Queen's University Faculty of Education and the Trent-Queen's Concurrent Education program, J. Clair Bailey's work was especially focused on 'Literacy and Learning' and how achievement in both can be realized through engagement across the curriculum. This scholarship is awarded in his name, to a primary-junior aspiring teacher at the end of their third year in Trent's Teacher Education Stream program, who has demonstrated personal insight and a passion for children's literacy and learning, through coursework and in practicum settings.

» Bata Scholarship

The gift of Thomas J. Bata, one of the original honourary sponsors of the University and a member of the Board of Governors from 1963-1973. Awarded to promising students in their second year of study.

» John Bernard Scholarship €

Established by John Bernard, President of Donna Cona. One award will be distributed annually to an outstanding Indigenous student who is entering Trent University and whose work contributes to the wise use of technology within Indigenous communities. These funds are awarded through direct application to Indspire.

» Bews Scholarship

Awarded to students in their second, third and fourth year majoring in Ancient Greek & Roman Studies, French Studies, or English Literature, in that respective order based on academic achievement. These scholarships were established by W.A. (Bill) and Vena Bews, parents of Professor Janet P. Bews of Trent University.

» Janet Bews Scholarship in Alzheimer Disease and Related Dementias

Established by the Alzheimer Society of Peterborough and Area in memory of Professor Janet P. Bews, a member of the Trent Classics Department from 1966 to 1999 and a strong advocate for the Alzheimer Society. Awarded to one or two collaborative student(s) enrolled in Trent-Fleming School of Nursing Program courses at the 3000 or 4000 level or compressed students enrolled in 2000-level Nursing courses at the time of application, and showing a career interest in nursing care for persons with dementia. Selection is based on academic merit, an essay, and an interview application process.

» J.P. Bickell Foundation Mining Scholarships

Scholarships are awarded to students studying mining, including the geological and geophysical fields. In current terminology, that would include environmental geosciences, geological sciences, earth sciences programs and mining engineering.

» Binney & Smith Scholarship

Established by Binney & Smith (Canada) Ltd. of Lindsay. Awarded to students in the Teacher Education Stream of the School of Education and Professional Learning.

» Biology Department Scholarship

Awarded to a student of high academic achievement and promise entering the fourth year of the Biology program. Students may only receive this scholarship once per degree.

» The BMO Financial Group Scholarship

Established by the BMO Financial Group. Awarded annually to an undergraduate student who combines high academic standing and community involvement.

» Maurice Boote Scholarship

Established in honour of Maurice J. Boote, one of the founding faculty members of Trent University and the first chair of the Economics Department. Awarded to an outstanding student entering the fourth year of the Honours program in Economics.

» Winifred Elizabeth Burton Scholarship

A scholarship of \$2,000. Awarded to an outstanding student entering first or a higher year.

» Cyril and Jenny Carter Scholarship in Mathematics

Awarded to a student of high academic achievement and promise entering the second, third, or fourth year of the Mathematics program.

» Cyril and Jenny Carter Scholarships in Environmental Studies

Awarded to a student of high academic achievement and promise entering the second, third, or fourth year of the Environmental & Resource Studies program.

» Anthony Cekota Scholarships

Established to honour Anthony Cekota, a self-made man who edited and published a chain of magazines and newspapers in his native Czechoslovakia. He also authored several books and papers on problems of industrial management and sociology, and continued as a consultant and advisor on industrial relations following his retirement after 45 years with the Bata Shoe organization. Awarded to students demonstrating exceptional academic performance.

» Sylvia Cherney Scholarship

The gift of the late Harry Cherney, and of Brian Cherney and Lawrence Cherney, is named in memory of Sylvia Cherney. Awarded to in-course students majoring in English Literature with the aim of encouraging promise and interest in the study of drama.

» Children of Alumni Scholarship

Established in 1987 to recognize that the second generation, the children of our alumni, was at hand. To qualify, at least one of the applicant's parents or grandparents must have graduated or received an honorary degree from Trent University, or completed five or more courses at Trent.

» City of Kawartha Lakes Scholarship

Established by the Town of Lindsay. Awarded to an entering student of high academic achievement from the City of Kawartha Lakes who has also demonstrated peer leadership in the school setting and involvement in community affairs.

» City of Quinte West Scholarship

Established by the Corporation of the City of Trenton. Awarded to an entering student who resides in the City of Quinte West.

» Cranston Scholarship

A gift of alumnus John Cranston and alumna Mary Cranston. Awarded to a current Trent student who has demonstrated considerable academic improvement while at Trent.

» Howard Darling Scholarship

Established in honour of Howard Darling, supervisor, Grounds and Custodial services. Awarded to an upper-year student who has demonstrated excellence in Environmental & Resource Studies.

» Department of English Literature Scholarship

The gift of the Department of English Literature. Awarded to the best student entering the fourth year of the Honours program in English Literature.

» Roscoe F. Downey Scholarship

The gift of the late Roscoe F. Downey of Peterborough. Awarded to an entering student from Peterborough or Victoria County.

» Margaret Doxey Scholarship in Political Science

Established to honour Professor Emerita, Margaret Doxey who was a trailblazer as a female professor with Trent's Department of Political Studies. Awarded to an upper-year student in third or fourth year who has written the best paper on a topic that explores a political issue that has a significant international dimension. Students must be enrolled as a major in Political Studies and must have a minimum GPA of 80%. Nominations will be made by faculty in the Department of Political Studies.

» William Paxton Eastwood Scholarship

The gift of the late William Paxton Eastwood, a former citizen of Peterborough and Ocala, Florida. Awarded in recognition of academic excellence.

» Roy L. Edwards Scholarship

Established in honour of Roy L. Edwards, one of the founding faculty members of Trent University and the first chair of the Biology department. Awarded to two outstanding students entering the fourth year of the Honours program in Biology. The aim of these scholarships is to encourage promise and interest in the study of freshwater ecology and in terrestrial ecology.

» Ewing Memorial Scholarships and Honours Awards

The gift of the late C. W. Ewing, a native of Warkworth, Ontario. Scholarships are awarded to students entering the University. Awards are available to students entering the fourth year based upon financial need and academic achievement.

» Faculty Scholarship

The gift of a member of the founding academic staff of Trent University. Awarded to an entering student living in residence.

» Reginald R. Faryon Scholarships

The gift of the Quaker Oats Company of Canada in memory of the late Reginald R. Faryon, a former president of the company and an active member of the Founding Board of Trent University.

» Robert M. Fowler Scholarship

The gift of the Quaker Oats Company of Canada in memory of the late Robert M. Fowler, a former member of the Board of Directors of Quaker Oats, and the Board of Governors of Trent University. Awarded to a student in the final year of the Business Administration program.

» Marion Fry Scholarship in the Humanities

Established in 2017 by family, friends and colleagues in honour of Dr. Marion Fry, a Philosophy professor and first principal of Catharine Parr Traill College who later became the vice-president of Trent from 1975-79 and periodic acting president. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student in second year and above and in the Humanities based upon academic achievement. Preference will be given to students affiliated withTraill College. May be renewable.

» Lida Ghoreishi Memorial Scholarship in Nursing

Established by family and friends and Trent staff and faculty to honour Lida Ghoreishi and her love and passion for neonatal and pediatric Nursing. Lida graduated from the Trent Nursing Program in 2016. This scholarship will be awarded to a student enrolled in 3000 or 4000 level Nursing courses and pursuing a career in maternal-child and family-centred Nursing. Selection based on academic merit and an essay application process.

» Rufus Gibbs Scholarships

The gift of the late Rufus C. Gibbs born in Peterborough in 1882. Rufus settled in Vancouver in 1908 and established Gibbs Tool and Stamping Works Limited. Awarded to students in all years, on the basis of academic standing, all-round achievement and character.

» John Gilchrist Memorial Scholarship

Named in memory of John Gilchrist, a distinguished medieval scholar who taught at Trent. Awarded to an upper-year student with a single or joint-major in one of Ancient Greek & Roman Studies , Canadian Studies, Cultural Studies, English Literature, History, Modern Languages, or Philosophy.

» Hector and Geraldine Elizabeth Gray Scholarships

The gift of the late Hector and Geraldine Elizabeth Gray. Awarded to students entering the third year of a Bachelor of Arts program.

» Green and White Athletic Scholarships

Athletic financial scholarships offered to student athletes who have achieved an average above 80% and have been recruited for athletics skills and abilities. Student-athletes coming from high school need a minimum 80% entering average. Returning student-athletes or student-athletes who transferred or have attended another post-secondary institution previously, require a minimum 70% average.

» Dorothy Greenley Special Education Scholarship

The Dorothy Greenley Special Education Scholarship fund is to be awarded to the top Bachelor of Education student ("Recipient") in the courses such as Supporting Literacy and Learners with Special Needs and who demonstrates qualities that will ensure an exceptional teacher for students with special needs.

» Wayne Greenley Music Scholarship

Established by Michael Greenley in tribute to his father Philip Wayne Greenley '68. To be awarded to a third-year student in the Teacher Education Stream. Preference will be given to a student majoring in Cultural Studies with demonstrated interest, experience and future plans related to a vocal music program with students in elementary school. Application required.

» Peter Gzowski Northern Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the law firm Heenan Blaikie, and by his friends across Canada, to honour the late Peter Gzowski, the eighth chancellor of Trent University. One scholarship is awarded annually to an academically outstanding undergraduate with a demonstrated interest in northern and polar studies and who has engaged in northern research as part of his or her undergraduate studies.

» The F. A. Hagar Scholarship

Established in 1988 by the friends and colleagues of Professor Hagar to mark his retirement from the Department of History. Assists a recent graduate of the Bachelors or Master's programs at Trent to fund travel to pursue a postgraduate degree at an accredited post-secondary institution in the British Isles or India in the fields of British or Indian history or English literature. Deadline of June 1 for application (see Financial Aid Office for details). If there are not any suitable candidates meeting this criteria, it can be awarded to graduate students at Trent pursuing an English or history degree to support their research travel to the UK or India.

» Brian Heeney Scholarship

Established in memory of Brian Heeney, former Provost and Vice-President Academic of Trent, by his family, friends and colleagues. To be awarded to an outstanding student entering first year.

» Heritage Scholarship

This scholarship honours the Curtis and Milburn families, both of which settled very early in the Peterborough area and have contributed continuously to its development. It is awarded to two or more outstanding students entering the final year of the Honours program in English Literature.

» Hockey Alumni Athletic Award

Established by Trent alumni who love the game of hockey. Awarded to upper-year full-time students based upon financial need and good standing. Preference will be given to men and/or women playing extramural or intermural hockey at Trent. OTSS guidelines apply.

» George Henry and Jane Laing Howson Scholarship

The gift of the late Miss A. Howson and the late Mrs. M. H. Simpson, in memory of their late parents. Awarded to a student with high academic standing who is proceeding to the degree of Bachelor of Arts.

» Tom Hutchinson Scholarship

Named in honour of Professor Emeritus Tom Hutchinson, one of Canada's foremost ecologists and instrumental in establishing the Sustainable Agriculture and Food Systems Program. To be awarded to an undergraduate student entering fourth year and majoring in SAFS with the highest overall average.

» Francis Dean Kerr Scholarship

The gift of the late Mrs. F. D. Kerr of Peterborough in honour of her late husband, who was one of the original honorary sponsors of the University.

» Margaret Laurence Scholarship

Named in honour of the late Margaret Laurence, a former chancellor of the University. Awarded for outstanding achievement in the fields of Canadian literature or Canadian Studies.

» Anthony Lieb Scholarship in the Classics

Established by the Estate of Anthony Lieb '73. To be awarded to the top continuing student with a single or joint major in Ancient Greek and Roman Studies or a specialization in Mediterranean Archaeology.

» Lodge Physics Scholarships

Named in honour of the founding chair of the Physics & Astronomy Department. Awarded to the best student in each of the first, second, and third years who is entering the next year of a single- or joint-major program in Physics, Chemical Physics, Computing Systems & Physics, or Mathematical Physics. The award is based on Physics courses leading to the major or joint-major.

» Marys' Fund Scholarship

Established in honour of Mary Margaret (Stuart) Beattie and Mary Marjorie (Murphy) Beattie, respectively the late mother and late wife of the donor, David Beattie. Awarded to an outstanding student entering the final year of the Honours program in Philosophy.

» Dr. Ross Matthews Scholarship

Established in honour of the late Dr. Ross Matthews. Awarded to an entering student for demonstrated academic excellence.

» Ralph McEwen Forestry Scholarship

Established with an estate gift from Canadian Author, Jessie E. McEwen (1898-1986) in honour of her brother Ralph McEwen who died at the age of 12. Awarded for the highest marks to students completing second year in the Trent School of the Environment and have taken courses in forestry and/or have undertaken outstanding forestry-related projects.

» Ralph McEwen Scholarship in Canadian Literature and Canadian Social History Established with an estate gift from Canadian Author, Jessie E. McEwen (1898-1986) in honour of her brother Ralph McEwen who died at the age of 12. Scholarships are awarded for excellence to students who are undertaking courses in Canadian literature or Canadian social history.

» Jean McKerracher Scholarship in Biology

Awarded to outstanding student(s) entering the fourth year of the Honours program in Biology or Biochemistry or Biomedical with the aim of encouraging promise and interest in a career in health services.

» Robin Morris Scholarship

Established by her family and friends, in memory of Robin Morris ('91). Awarded annually to a student in the Business Administration program whose spirit, enthusiasm, and commitment to Human Resource Management is considered to be outstanding.

» Justice Samuel H. Murphy Scholarship

This scholarship was established by friends, colleagues, and family members to honour and remember Mr. Justice Samuel H. Murphy. It is awarded to the student entering fourth year with the highest average earned in courses in Canadian politics and political theory.

» William Allan Newell Scholarship

The gift of the late Judson Newell of Prescott in honour of his father, the chairman and founder of the Newell Manufacturing Co., Ltd. Awarded to an entering student proceeding to the degree of Bachelor of Science.

» Mary L. Northway Scholarship

Established in honour of Mary Northway. Awarded to one or two students with the highest academic average entering into the fourth year of the Honours program in Canadian Studies.

» Dr. Charles Omole Medical Scholarship

Established by Dr. Charles Omole, an alumnus of the original class of 1964 upon his death in 2012. Charles never forgot how important Trent was on his path to becoming a general surgeon in Wingham, Ontario. To be awarded to a full-time upper-year undergraduate student pursuing Trent courses BIOM 4450Y: Placement in Health Sciences or BIOM 4460H: Internship in Medical Sciences with the intention to become a doctor, or to a student enrolled in current or future Trent University medically-related courses or programs that are approved by the Selections Committee. See Biology Department for application procedures.

» Robert Paehlke Scholarship

Named in honour of Professor Emeritus Robert C. Paehlke who was the founding chair of the Environmental and Resource Studies/Science program in 1972. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student in third or fourth year in the Trent School of the Environment based upon academic achievement. Preference will be given to students excelling in environmental journalism or environmental communication.

» Robert J. D. Page Scholarship

Established to honour Dr. Robert J. D. Page who was a trailblazer with Trent's ERS program from its beginnings. Awarded annually to a student entering fourth year in the Trent School of the Environment's (TSE) ERS program (BSc., BA or BESS) who best combines academic achievement and public environmental service. The recipient is selected by the TSE Student Awards Committee.

» Peterborough Examiner Scholarship

The gift of the Peterborough Examiner Co. Ltd. Awarded to an outstanding student entering first or a higher year and living in residence.

» Daniel Powell Scholarship

This scholarship reflects Professor Daniel Powell's passion for international development and teaching. It is also tied to his love for Latin America and its people, as he felt very close to their struggles and aspirations. This renewable scholarship is awarded to Latin American students entering Trent University who are intending to major in International Development Studies. Based upon academic achievement, financial barriers, and community and/or volunteer service. If there are no students who qualify in the International Development Studies (IDS) program, it can be awarded to Latin American students entering Trent in any program.

» Quaker Oats Company of Canada Limited Scholarships in the Humanities Established by the Quaker Oats Company of Canada Limited. Two scholarships awarded to deserving students entering the fourth year of an Honours degree in the humanities.

» Jennifer A. Reed Leadership Scholarship

Established in memory of Jennifer Reed (Alumna '88) by family, friends and colleagues for her enormous love of life and country and her involvement with the Governor General's Canadian Leadership Conferences. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student in second year and above in any program with a minimum average of 80%. The student must have demonstrated leadership qualities that contribute to Trent's mission, the community or the country as a whole.

» J. J. Robinette Scholarships

Established by friends and colleagues to honour the 60th anniversary of Dr. J. J. Robinette's call to the Bar. He was a member of the Trent's first Board of Governors, and chancellor of the University from 1984 to 1987.

» Helen and Barney Sandwell Scholarship

The gift of the distinguished Canadian publisher B. D. Sandwell, a long-time member of the Trent Board and its chair from 1971 to 1975, and of his wife Helen. Awarded to an outstanding student majoring in English Literature entering the third year of a degree program.

» Frank and Reata Scott Scholarship

The gift of the late Helen Whiteside in memory of her parents. Awarded to a student entering the third year of a Bachelor of Arts program and renewable in the fourth year provided that the student maintains a scholarship standing of 80%.

» Katherine E. Scott Scholarship

The gift of the late Dr. C. M. Scott of Peterborough, in honour of his late wife.

» William Bligh Shaw Scholarship

The gift of Muriel Beatrice Shaw. Awarded to an outstanding student in the first year of the Business Administration Program.

» The Shibatani Group International Scholarship in Water Science

Established by Robert Shibatani, Alum '84. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student who is entering fourth year of the Watershed Science degree program with the highest overall academic average. Preference will be given to students with community service, personal integrity and humility and an unselfish willingness to help others

» Shoppers Drug Mart Scholarships

The gift of Imasco Ltd. Awarded to students of high academic achievement entering first or a higher year in the University.

» Slavin Research Scholarship in Physics & Astronomy

Established in 2011 by Prof. Alan Slavin and Linda Slavin, along with students, friends, and colleagues, upon Prof. Slavin's retirement after 38 years at Trent. The scholarship will be awarded yearly to a graduate-program applicant who will be supervised by a faculty member of the Department of Physics & Astronomy, and/or to an upper-year undergraduate student enrolled in the Physics program and who will be supervised by a faculty member of the Department of Physics & Astronomy.

The gift of the late H. Clare Sootheran of Peterborough. Awarded for excellence in the humanities.

» Doreen (Larmer) Stewart Nursing Scholarship

Established by Doreen J. Stewart, retired RN, in honour of her lifelong passion for nursing. Up to three scholarships of \$2,500 will be available by application for full- time nursing students in any year at Trent University. Preference will be given to students with demonstrated financial need, with longstanding connections in the City of Peterborough or surrounding rural areas.

» Ian Stonehewer Memorial Scholarship

The gift of Mr. and Mrs. John Stonehewer in honour of Ian Stonehewer, BA Honours 1975. Awarded for excellence to a student entering the fourth year of the Honours program in History.

» TD Green Undergraduate Scholarships

To support full-time undergraduate students working towards undergraduate degrees in: Environmental Resource Science, Environmental & Resource Studies, Geography, Chemistry, Indigenous Environmental Studies, Biology, Bachelor of Environmental Science/Studies, Water Sciences and Ecological Restoration.

» Carolyn Sarah Thomson Scholarship

Established by the late Carolyn Sarah Thomson, a Trent alumna who was intensely loyal to Trent and to the people - faculty, staff and students - who make the University unique. It is awarded for excellence to students entering second year and third year of the Canadian Studies program.

» Trent University Foundation Scholarship

Established by the current and past volunteer directors of Trent University Foundation and the support staff of the Foundation. Awarded to a returning student in the fourth year of an Honours program. Preference will be given to students in the humanities and social sciences.

» Trent University General Scholarships

Initiated by the employees of Trent University and supported by alumni, friends, and advocates. Awarded to students entering the University from schools of the Public or Separate Boards of Peterborough or Victoria County on the basis of academic standing.

» Trent University Social & Athletic Scholarship

The gift of the employees of Trent University. Awarded to students entering the University from schools of the Public or Separate Boards of Peterborough or Victoria County on the basis of academic standing and all-round achievement and character.

» Walker Wood Foundation Scholarships

These renewable scholarships are awarded to entering students in the Trent Medical Professional Stream with involvement in extracurricular activities and demonstrated financial need. This scholarship is renewed in each of the succeeding three years of study providing an academic average of 80% is maintained in five Trent University credits in each academic year and with continued proven financial need. Value of scholarship is \$4,000 per year.

» June Woodend Scholarship in Community Palliative Care Nursing

Established in memory of June Winifred Woodend by her family. June was a Public Health nurse and lifelong volunteer who established a volunteer palliative care program at her community hospital. Awarded to a student, in second or third year of the collaborative or compressed Trent-Fleming School of Nursing Program, who shows a career interest in community-based palliative care. Selection is based on academic merit and an essay application process.

Trent University Durham Scholarships & Awards

» The James Edward Munro Awards €

Established by Frances, Terry and Warren Munro in honour of husband and father James Edward Munro. Two awards will be given out annually to Trent Durham GTA full-time undergraduate students. One award will be given out to a student of indigenous heritage who has completed at least one year in any program and is engaged in some form of extracurricular activity on campus. A second award will be given out to a student who achieved distinction in an academic course on indigenous studies.

» Ed & Sylvia Vanhaverbeke Durham Scholarship

Established by the founders of Syvan Developments Limited who believe in supporting students in their region. A scholarship of \$1,000 will be awarded to a student at Trent Durham GTA returning for the final year of the Bachelor of Business Administration program with at least 12 credits. Candidates must have a GPA of 80% or higher and engaged in community service.

International Scholarships

The following scholarships are available for international visa students. They require a scholarship application to Trent International accompanied by an application for admission to Trent University. trentu.ca/futurestudents/international-undergraduate

» Justin Chiu International Scholarship

Established by Justin Chiu, who benefited from the Trent experience as an international student. Awarded to entering international students from Asia who demonstrates outstanding academic achievement, community service, leadership potential, and some financial need. Scholarships partially fund the costs of a Trent education in the amount between \$3,000 and \$15,000, renewable to allow students to obtain a Bachelor (Honours) degree from Trent University (some other conditions apply).

» Global Citizen Scholarships and Awards

Awarded to entering international students who demonstrates outstanding academic achievement, community service, leadership potential, and some financial need. Scholarships partially fund the costs of a Trent education in the amount between \$2,000 and \$21,000, renewable to allow students to obtain a Bachelor (Honours) degree from Trent University (some other conditions apply).

» Alena Heitlinger WUSC Scholarship

The Alena Heitlinger WUSC Scholarship is funded by David Morrison and Alena Heitlinger, and named for Alena Heitlinger, retired Trent Professor of Sociology (1975-2014). She herself was a refugee student in Britain supported by World University Service (WUS) following the Soviet invasion of Czechoslovakia in 1968. This Scholarship will be awarded to a student who has come to Trent through the WUSC selection process. The WUSC Refugee Scholar must be studying at Trent University in a full-time capacity (3.5 credits or higher), have a minimum 75% average, and has the highest grade among currently registered WUSC students. This award may be given to the same student but is not automatically renewed. Awarded to students in their 2nd, 3rd, or 4th year of study.

» IB Scholarships

All international students applying for admission to Trent on the basis of an IB diploma will be automatically considered for IB Scholarships. To qualify for a CDN\$1,000 IB Scholarship students must have a minimum IB score of 28. The scholarship can be combined with a Trent University Entrance Scholarship and/or Global Citizen Scholarships and Awards.

» Moore Family International Student Scholarships

Established by David and Joan Moore to support international undergraduate students from outside of North America. These scholarships are renewable for a maximum of four years based on academic achievement. Scholarships will be awarded by application. Value of scholarship begins at \$12,000 annually up to a maximum of four (4) years.

» Scotiabank International Student Scholarships

The Scotiabank International Scholarships are to support students upon entrance to Trent University from countries in which Scotiabank operates internationally, and are based upon academic excellence. Renewable to a maximum of four years per student provided that academic performance is maintained. Value up to \$5,000 per year per student.

» TIP Tuition Levy Scholarship

This renewable scholarship is funded by the students of Trent University through an annual levy. Based on high academic achievement and a strong record of community and/or international service, it is awarded each year to a student from a developing country. It covers international tuition fees and ancillary fees.

» Trent-UWC Scholarships

Awarded to an international student entering Trent University from a UWC college who demonstrates outstanding academic achievement, community service and leadership potential. The value of the scholarship is determined upon assessment of financial need. Students must be nominated by their UWC college.



Prizes Awarded by Departments

Prizes are awarded automatically by the departments unless otherwise specified.

» Alliances Prize 📦

The prize will be used to fund or recognize small projects related to Indigenous-non-Indigenous alliance-building and education, such as digital stories, website development, workshops and other activities that promote respectful Indigenous-non-Indigenous relations. Available to undergraduate or graduate students.

» Anthropology Faculty Prize

Awarded to a student with the highest overall standing in the introductory course in Anthropology from the previous year.

» Bachelor of Social Work Prize

Established by alumni, faculty, staff, and the support of the community to reward students who show outstanding dedication to the standards of the profession and a commitment to social justice/action. Students will be selected by a committee based upon accomplishments and evaluations during field placements in their fourth-year placement.

» Bagnani Anthropology, Archaeology & Classics Fund

Established by the Gilbert and Stewart Bagnani Trust to honour Gilbert and Stewart Bagnani. This fund is used to advance and enhance the success of anthropology, archaeology, and classics programs and activities based out of Trent University. Annual spending decisions will be made by a committee comprised of the following: Directors and/or Chairs of the Graduate and Undergraduate Programs in Anthropology & Archaeology, the Director of the Ancient Greek and Roman Studies program and the Director of TUARC and external member(s) with knowledge or connection to the Bagnani legacy.

» Sir Donald Banks Prize

This prize, the gift of Professor D.L. Smith, in memory of her father. Awarded to a promising student studying abroad, with preference to students studying at a Spanish university.

» Bruce Barrett Memorial Prizes

Established in memory of Bruce Barrett, a former Trent Philosophy student. Several prizes awarded to outstanding students in first-year courses in Philosophy.

» Peter & Karen Barrett Prize in Environmental Chemistry

As a professor at Trent for 30 years, Professor Emeritus Peter Barrett's gifted teaching touched the lives of many students in his first-year Chemistry and Environmental Sciences classes. This prize is awarded to an undergraduate student majoring a chemistry program and based upon academic excellence in environmental chemistry courses, upon completion of third-year courses.

» Bernard Blishen Prize in Canadian Sociology

Established by the family of Professor Bernard Blishen, CM, to honour him as a leading sociologist of his time. He was instrumental in advancing sociology as an academic discipline in Canada. As the founding chair of Trent's Department of Sociology, Prof. Blishen set the direction for a strong program grounded in an understanding of Canada through empirical and theoretical scholarship. This prize is to be awarded to a Sociology student in his/her final year with the best paper in Canadian sociology, as determined by the faculty.

» Biology Department Prizes

This fund was established by the Department of Biology in recognition of the retirement of Jim Sutcliffe, Michael Fox and future retirees. The Biology Department Prizes for high academic achievement in first, second, and third year, the Biology Conservation Prize and the Biomedical Prize are awarded annually from this fund.

» Botany Prize

Awarded annually to a second- or third-year student who shows excellence and promise in plant biology.

» Roy T. Bowles Sociology Research Prize

The purpose of the Roy T. Bowles Sociology Research Prize is to support the research of fourth year honours students in research necessary to the completion of honours theses in the Sociology Program in Peterborough or Oshawa.

» Breukelaar Prize in Laboratory Physics

Established in recognition of the many years of service of Senior Physics Demonstrator John Breukelaar. Awarded to the student displaying the highest academic standard in senior laboratory courses in physics.

» School of Business Study Abroad Prize

Established by Jesse Ledger '97. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate business student with distinction in a study abroad program. Application by letter, chosen by committee.

» Gordon T. Campbell Prize

In memory of Gordon T. Campbell ('77) a former Trent Geography student and rower. Preference will be given to an undergraduate student in Geography with a demonstrated and continuing interest in the Canadian North. If there are no students who qualify, it may be awarded to any qualified student in the Trent School of Environment.

» Canadian Association of Geographers' Undergraduate Prize

Established by the Canadian Association of Geographers. Awarded each year to the Honours Geography student at Trent who is judged to have the best academic record in fourth year.

» Canadian Society for Chemistry Silver Medals

The top student entering the final year of a chemistry-related program is awarded a silver-plated medal and certificate in recognition of outstanding academic achievement.

» Robert Chambers Prize

Established in 1996 to honour Professor Robert Chambers on his retirement. Awarded to the best student graduating from the Honours program in English Literature.

» Donald Chase Memorial Prize

Established in memory of Donald Chase, a Trent student in 1989. Awarded for the best essay in Canadian history written by a first-year undergraduate at Trent.

» Elizabeth Collins Nursing Leadership Prize

This prize was established by the family of Elizabeth Collins to honour the many years that she demonstrated excellence in nursing leadership in both the hospital and public health sectors. Elizabeth was a dynamic, transformational leader who was a strong champion for the power of nursing in making a positive difference in the lives of patients. Awarded to a full-time or part-time student enrolled in the Trent-Fleming School of Nursing Program at the 3000 or 4000 level who models excellent leadership qualities.

» William B. Common, QC, LLD Memorial Prize

This book prize is awarded annually to the student with the highest overall average in first-year macroeconomics.

» Computer Science Prize

Awarded to the outstanding student(s) graduating from a single or joint-major program in Computer Science.

» Consul General's Prizes in French

The gift of the consul general of France. Awarded to the leading undergraduates in French Studies within the University.

» Costello Roebuck Grant Fund

This fund provides financial support to students in the Business Administration Program in order to allow them to participate in activities to enhance their educational program. By application to the School of Business.

» CRC Press Freshman Chemistry Achievement Award

A gift of a copy of the CRC Handbook of Chemistry and Physics from the CRC Press Inc. Awarded to a student at the end of first year on the basis of outstanding academic achievement in Chemistry.

» James Creery Memorial Essay Prize

Established in memory of James Harold Creery, a Trent student of Philosophy from 1972 to 1974. Awarded for the best philosophical essay written by an undergraduate at Trent.

» Currie Honours Prizes

Awarded to a geography student(s) enrolled in courses that focus on human or physical geography featuring independent work under the supervision of a faculty member. Preference will be given to recipients in the following courses: GEOG-4010Y, GEOG-4020D, GEOG-4830Y. If there are no geography students who qualify, it may be awarded to students in TSE based upon both academic excellence and proposed thesis research. A minimum individual total prize of \$1000 is available annually for up to three students.

» Department of Biology Prizes

Awarded to students who show excellence in the study of Biology in first or higher years.

» Department of Geography Prizes

Awarded in the first and second year to students who show excellence in the study of geography. The second-year prize, known as the Geography alumni prize, is donated by the Trent University Geographical Society using funds contributed by Geography alumni.

» Department of Physics & Astronomy Prize

A gift of the Department of Physics & Astronomy. Awarded to the student with the highest combined average in the Introductory Physics courses. Must be taken in the same year.

» Department of Psychology Prizes

Established by the Psychology Department. Four prizes are awarded from this fund: The Second-Year Prize awarded to the psychology major achieving the highest standing in Psychology 215. The Third-year Prize awarded to the student eligible to graduate with a General degree in Psychology, who achieves the highest overall average in all 300- and 400-level psychology courses completed. The Fourth-Year Prize is awarded to the student, eligible to graduate with an Honours degree in Psychology, who achieves the highest overall average in al psychology courses completed. The Gina Gesser Memorial Prize was established in memory of a former graduate of Trent's Psychology Honours thesis program. Awarded to the fourth-year student achieving the highest standing in the honours thesis in psychology.

» Jim Dolan/Ron Reid Alumni Rugby Prize

These prizes are awarded to Trent Rugby players on the men and women's varsity teams. The recipients are chosen by their teammates based upon the player(s) who demonstrates the most heart and desire on their team.

» Rosemary Faye Dolan Rugby Prize

These prizes are awarded to Trent Rugby players on the women's varsity team. The recipients are chosen by their teammates based upon the player(s) who demonstrates the most heart and desire on their team.

» J. Emmett Duff Memorial Prize in Geography

A gift from Professor T. H. B. Symons, Celanese Canada Inc., and John D. Stevenson, QC, in memory of the late J. Emmett Duff, who, without formal training in the subject, was possessed of an intense love of traditional geography. Awarded to the Geography Honours student (single- or joint-major) who has demonstrated the best application and communication of a research project using Geographical Information Systems (GIS). If there are no geography students who qualify then it may be awarded to any student in the School of the Environment who has demonstrated the best application and communication of a research project using Geographical Information Systems (GIS).

» Ecological Restoration Achievement Prize

Awarded annually to the graduating student in the Ecological Restoration BSc who has achieved the highest standing.

» Elders Text Prize €

This prize was established by the Aboriginal Education Council from the royalties of the text In the Words of Elders by Professors Kulchyski, McCaskill, and Newhouse. The prize(s) are awarded to students of Aboriginal ancestry in a program of study at Trent on the basis of achievement, community contribution, and financial need.

» Jim & Barbara English Prize

Prize established in honour of Jim and Barb English. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student entering fourth year BA or BSc in the Trent School of the environment who demonstrates meaningful volunteer work including an active record and/or ongoing commitment to volunteerism. Preference will be given to recipients with personal integrity and an unselfish willingness to help others. A letter supporting volunteer activities or a letter of support from a Trent professor are required. By application or by nomination by Trent faculty or staff. Note: Students receiving NSERC, SHERC or internship support are not eligible to apply for this prize.

» Environmental & Resource Studies Program Prize

Supported by the Environmental & Resource Studies program. Awarded to a student in their first year at Trent achieving the highest combined academic standing in the introductory ERS courses. Both courses must be taken in the same year.

» Timothy Findley Creative Writing Prize

Established in honour of Timothy Findley. Awarded on the basis of adjudicated submissions of fiction, poetry, drama, or creative non-fiction for creative writing of special merit.

» First Peoples House of Learning Award

This fund is primarily intended to provide emergency support to students of Aboriginal identify or heritage including First Nations, Inuit or Metis people from the Peterborough or Durham campuses.

» First Year Essay Prize in History

This prize, awarded by members of the History Department, goes to the student in the first quarter of his or her program who writes the best essay in History.

» Donald Fleming Memorial History Prize

Established by family and friends in memory of the late Donald Fleming. Awarded each year to a third- or fourth-year student submitting an outstanding essay in modern European history.

» Forensic Science Student of Excellence Prize

This prize recognizes a student in their final year of the core Forensic Science program who has displayed excellence during their years in the Program. This awards is jointly funded by the The Forensic Science Department and the Forensic Science Society.

» Marjorie Elizabeth Foster Prize

Given in memory of Marjorie Elizabeth Foster. The award is made to the Geography single- or joint-major who achieves the highest average GEOG 3100H: Geography of Peterborough & the Kawarthas, epitomizing the spirit of an integrated geographical approach to the study of Geography.

» Founders' Prize in Geography

This prize was established by alumni in recognition of the founders of the Trent University Geography Department, Professors Peter Adams and Fred Helleiner. It is awarded to the Geography single- or joint-major with the highest overall average in the 3rd or 4th year.

» Greater Peterborough Chamber of Commerce Business Student Leadership Prize
To be awarded to an undergraduate student who has completed at least 12 credits in the
School of Business. Students must be returning in the Fall to complete fourth year, and have
demonstrated great potential as a leader in business and displayed academic excellence, but not
necessarily held the top mark. Students must have exhibited initiative beyond the boundaries of
academics.

» Gregory R. Frith Memorial Prize in Cultural Studies

Established in honour of the late Gregory R. Frith, BA Honours 1977. Awarded to an undergraduate student for the best submission in any of the arts associated with the Cultural Studies program to a juried competition held by the program. Value \$300.

» Honourable Leslie Frost Prize

The gift of the late Hon. Leslie M. Frost, PC, premier of Ontario from 1949 to 1962 and first chancellor of Trent University. Awarded to the leading undergraduate in the first-year course in Canadian history.

» Gadfly Prizes

Awarded to an outstanding undergraduate in Philosophy in each of the second and third years. The prizes commemorate Socrates's description of himself as one who rouses and reproves the society in which he lives just as a gadfly awakens a sluggish horse.

» Louise Garrow Prize <</p>

Established to honour the contribution of Louise Garrow to the Indigenous Studies program. Awarded to a student in the program demonstrating high academic achievement and contribution to student life.

» David Glassco Prize

Established in honour of David Glassco, long-time faculty member in the Department of English Literature and former principal of Champlain College. Given to a student who has demonstrated outstanding generosity of spirit in a range of activities outside the classroom, including music, athletics, or theatre, in the Trent and Peterborough communities. The student may be a major in any discipline with a minimum average of 65%.

» Joseph Ernest Goodhead Prize

A gift from an anonymous donor. Awarded for excellence in Biology in the study of aquatic degradation.

» Jon and Shelagh Grant Prize for Inuit Students &

Established to encourage the continuation of education of second-, third- or fourth-year Inuit students. The annual prize may be split between two students. May be renewable.

» Grant Thornton Prize in Accounting

Presented by Grant Thornton, Chartered Accountants, to an undergraduate student in ADMN 3200H - Financial Management, who has demonstrated exceptional promise and enthusiasm for the study and dissemination of the principles and practices of accounting.

» Guinand Prize

This award, in honour of Andrew P. Guinand, the founding chair of the Department of Mathematics, is given annually to the top mathematics student entering the fourth year of his or her program.

» Graham Hartley Prize

Established by the Chemical Institute of Canada (Peterborough Section) in honour of Graham Harry Hartley, PhD, MCIC. Awarded to first- and second-year students who have shown excellence in the field of general chemistry.

» Honourable George S. Henry Prize

Established in memory of Hon. George S. Henry, prime minister of Ontario from 1930 to 1934, and member of the Legislative Assembly of Ontario for East York from 1913 to 1943. Awarded to the leading undergraduate in the first-year course in Political Studies.

» John Hillman Prize

Established to honour the former chair of the program for his years of leadership. Awarded to the student with the highest standing in fourth year International Development Studies.

» Professor Marg Hobbs Prize

This prize was established in honour of a long-time faculty member of the Department, Prof. Marg Hobbs, who retired several years ago. It is awarded to an outstanding graduate student in their final year of the Gender & Social Justice program whose performance in the program and community spirit has contributed significantly to the vitality of the Department.

» Linda Hubbell Book Prize

Named for Anthropology and Women's Studies professor Linda Hubbell and originally endowed by the Peterborough Women's Committee. Awarded based on academic achievement as well as contributions to the vitality of the program.

» Richard and Sinikka Hurley Prize

Awarded to high-achieving undergraduate student(s) registered with Student Accessibility Services (SAS) and completing the second or third year of a single-major or joint-major BSc Honours or General program in Computer Science. Available to Canadian or International students.

» Indigenous Environmental Studies (IES) Prizes 📦

Prizes awarded to students for contributions to indigenous environmental studies and to the student who has the highest grade graduating with an IES degree.

» IDS First-Year Prize

To be awarded to the first-year student with the highest full-credit combined standing in IDST 1001H and IDST 1002H.

» Innovation in Teaching Prize

The Innovation in Teaching Prize will be awarded annually to a BEd candidate in each of the following: Primary/Junior divisions; Intermediate/Senior divisions; part-time program (final year). Based on innovation in teaching and learning demonstrated in classroom placement.

» David Sutherland Irwin Prize

Established in memory of the late Professor David Irwin. Awarded on completion of CHEM-BIOL 3310H: Protein Chemistry and Enzymology and CHEM-BIOL 3320H: Metabolism to a student with outstanding performance in biochemistry.

» IDS First-Year Prize

To be awarded to the first-year student with the highest full-credit combined standing in IDST 1001H and IDST 1002H.

» P. K. Page Irwin Prize

Established by the family, friends, and admirers of P. K. Page Irwin to honour her extraordinary achievement in the arts. Awarded to a student who has shown special merit in creative writing and at least one of the other arts.

» Ronald G. Johnson Prize in Quantum Mechanics

Established by his former students and colleagues in recognition of the more than three decades of Dr. Johnson's teaching in Physics. Awarded annually to the student with the highest academic achievement in the fourth-year course in Quantum Mechanics.

» Daystar (Rosalie Jones) Prize for Indigenous Performance 📦

To be awarded to an Indigenous student in the CWSIS Indigenous Performance Program having successfully completed INDG 2010H and/or 2020H and/or 2110 with excellent grades, and who has demonstrated promising talent and exemplified commitment, teamwork and collaboration in her/his performance studies. The successful candidate to be jointly recommended by the instructors delivering these courses.

» Soonjin Jung Computer Science Prize

Awarded to a single major completing their third year of the Honours Computer Science Program with the highest GPA.

» James Jury Prize

Established to honour Prof. James Jury upon his retirement after more than 40 years of teaching in both the Physics and Computing Systems departments. This prize is awarded to a student in the third or fourth year who has demonstrated distinguished leadership within their department. The prize will alternate in successive years between students in the Physics & Astronomy and Computer Science departments.

- **» Kennett, Young and Nobels Outstanding Improvement Prize—Peterborough**Awarded to a student demonstrating the most impressive improvement in Psychology's undergraduate Advanced Statistics and Research Design course from the mid-term to the final grade.

» K. E. Kidd Memorial Prize 📦

Awarded each year to students who have demonstrated a high degree of ability and achievement in the Foundation of Indigenous Learning diploma program of the Chanie Wenjack School for Indigenous Studies.

» David Lasenby Prize

The David Lasenby Prize, a gift from the Alumni Association, honours an original class member and Biology professor whose campus sketches have long been admired. The \$100 prize will be awarded annually to a student contributor to the annual art show at Alumni House.

» Margaret Lightbody Prizes

Established in honour of Margaret Lightbody ('64), a local retired Mathematics teacher who has had a remarkable impact on the lives of her students. A member of Trent's original graduating class, she served on the Board of Governors (1993-1996). Two prizes are awarded by the School of Education & Professional Learning, the first to a student in the Teacher Education Stream with Mathematics as an elected teaching subject who is continuing on to the consecutive B.Ed. program at Trent, has shown promise in their undergraduate Mathematics program as an aspiring teacher, and who maintained at least a B- average in their mathematics courses. The second prize is awarded to a student in the consecutive B.Ed. program who is preparing to be a qualified teacher of Mathematics, and has demonstrated exceptional skill, enthusiasm and promise in classroom teaching.

» Helen E. MacNaughton Prize

Awarded to an outstanding student in Philosophy entering fourth year.

» J. Percy MacNaughton Prize

Awarded to the student achieving the highest academic standing in the School of the Environment entering the fourth year.

» Edna Manitowabi Prize 📦

The Edna Manitowabi Prize is associated with the performance element of academic work initiated by Professor Edna Manitowabi. Aboriginal students enrolled in the Chanie Wenjack School for Indigenous Studies classes which include the performance element are eligible for the prize. The prize winners will be chosen based on grades, participation, and excellence in their contribution to performance activities.

» Douglas McCalla History Book Prize

Named in honour of the distinguished Canadian historian and former member and Chair of the Trent History Department, and Master of Lady Eaton College, this prize is awarded to the honours student writing the best essay in the fourth year.

» Mary Magill Memorial Prize in Sociology

To be used to support undergraduate students who are conducting research as part of their Sociology degree (major or minor). Eligible students must be enrolled in courses involving various kinds of research: 4th year thesis projects, community or university-based research practicum, or course-based projects involving literature review and analysis. By application.

» Jane McLarty Memorial Prize

Established in memory of Jane McLarty, a member of Lady Eaton College from 1987 to 1990. Awarded to a deserving student entering the third or fourth year of studies in English Literature.

» Heather J. Glendinning McMurter Memorial Prize

Established in memory of Heather J. Glendinning McMurter, who graduated with a BSc from the Environmental Studies program in 1988. Awarded to a student entering the fourth year (having completed 15 courses) of the Environmental & Resource Studies program whose research paper at the 3000 or 4000 level is judged to be the best of the year.

» Christopher Michael Prize

A gift of the Economics Department. Awarded to the student achieving the highest academic standing in first-year Microeconomics.

» Midwives' Prize

A gift from three members of the Universities Liaison Committee who assisted at the birth of Trent University. The late Professor J. M. Blackburn, then of Queen's University; the late Dean Frank Stiling, then of the University of Western Ontario; and the late Dr. M. St. A. Woodside, former vice-president of the University of Toronto, were named by their universities to act as a liaison committee between these three universities and the Founding Board of Trent University. Awarded to the student with the highest overall standing in the first year.

» Norma Miller Prizes

The Norma Miller Prizes were established jointly by Catharine Parr Traill College and the Department of Ancient History & Classics. These prizes honour the memory of Norma P. Miller, an honourary fellow of Traill and frequent visitor to the Classics Department. Awarded to the student with the highest grade in the following courses: AHCL-ANTH 1200H (Trojan War), first year students only; AHCL-HIST 2103H (Approaches to Classical Historians); AHCL 2303H (Approaches to Classical Literature); AHCL-ANTH 2205H or 2206H (Archaeology and Art History of Ancient Greece or Rome); 4000 level (for AGRS majors enrolled in a senior seminar 4001H, 4002H, 4003H).

» Joyce Moonias Memorial Awards 😵

Donated by Frances Six in memory of Joyce Moonias, Native Studies student 1982-83. Awarded to the student with the highest academic standing in INDG 2800Y – Introduction to Nishnaabemowin.

» Garnet Morris/Sun Life Prize €

Awarded in recognition of a student of Aboriginal heritage who best demonstrates academic excellence and is in the Business Administration Program.

» W. L. Morton Essay Prize in History

Awarded to a third-year student for writing the best essay.

» John K. Muir Prize

Established by Tom Miller '82 and Barbara Chisholm to recognize their friend, John Muir '75, General Manager of Trent Radio. With more than 40 years of experience as a broadcaster, administrator and technician, John has been a creative force for the community and culture in Peterborough. To be awarded by a student committee to Trent-affiliated organizations, student groups or students who have been most influential in their own development.

» Seth Newhouse Prize €

This award, established by his great grandchildren to honour the memory of Seth Newhouse, Six Nations activist and historian, is presented to a student with high academic standing in INDG-POST 2000Y.

» David Newhouse Award

Established to honour the contributions of David Newhouse to Indigenous Studies at Trent University. Awarded to a student of indigenous heritage demonstrating academic achievement and contribution to student life.

» Nicholls/Civic Nurses Alumnae Prize

Awarded to a Trent-Fleming School of Nursing Program student enrolled in a 3000 or 4000 level clinical placement (NURS 3020H or 3021H; NURS 4020C, or 4021C) showing excellence in patient care.

» Alun Rees Organic Chemistry Prize

Established with a gift from Dr. Alun H. Rees, who taught chemistry at Trent for 26 years. Awarded to a student with outstanding performance in the field of organic chemistry, upon completion of CHEM 3102H - Advanced Synthetic, Organic Chemistry: Biological Applications.

» David Page Prize in Latin

This prize was established in 2007 to mark the retirement, after 39 years of excellent service to Trent, of Professor David F. R. Page. It is awarded to the first-year student with the highest grade in LATN 1001H: Elementary Latin 2, the course which meant the most to Professor Page.

» Pammett Historical Prize

Established by the late Howard Pammett (1909–1993), in honour of his parents, Robert and Ruby Pammett. Awarded, when merited, for the best student research essay on the history of the Kawartha District (defined as including the Counties of Peterborough, Victoria, Haliburton, Northumberland, Clarington, and the Algonquin Region). The recipient will be chosen by the chair of the History Department.

» Parkinson Society Dr. Ted Cragg Award

Established by the Parkinson Society, Peterborough/ Kawartha Chapter. \$1,000 to be awarded to a student enrolled in the Trent-Fleming School of Nursing Program with a B average and an interest in or experience with Parkinson's Disease. Students in the Collaborative program must be enrolled in 3000-level Nursing courses. Students in the Compressed program can apply when they are enrolled in 2000-level Nursing courses. The student must be willing to interview clients of the Society and facilitate a professional development session among Nursing students. A 500-word essay is required.

» Bonnie M. Patterson Leadership Development Grant

To be awarded to students enrolled in the Bachelor of Business Administration program to support their engagement with the community in order to develop their collaborative and entrepreneurial leadership skills. Application process.

» Peterborough Historical Atlas Foundation Prize

Awarded to the undergraduate whose essay or project on a Canadian subject is deemed outstanding. An interdisciplinary panel will select the winner from the entries submitted by faculty in appropriate disciplines.

» John Pettigrew Prizes

Established in memory of the late Professor John Pettigrew. Awarded for the best student essays submitted by students in a first-year English Literature course taking the course among their first five credits.

» Physical Science Student of Excellence Prize

Established by the Peterborough Professional Engineers Wives' Association. Awarded to an undergraduate who shows excellence in 2000-level courses in Physics or Chemistry.

» Powles Prize

Given in honour of Percival M. Powles, long-time member of the Biology Department. Awarded to a student entering the fourth year of the Biology program who has demonstrated excellence in the area of fisheries and aquatic sciences.

» Andrew Priestman Memorial Prize in Politics

A book prize established in honour of the late Andrew Priestman, Honours BA 1991. Awarded to a graduating student in Political Studies who has maintained a solid academic achievement and made an above-average contribution to student life and the activities of the Political Studies Department. Students and faculty are encouraged to make nominations.

» R & R Laboratories Prize in Analytical Chemistry & Makhija Prize in Chemistry

The R & R Laboratories Prize in Analytical Chemistry is awarded to a student with outstanding performance in analytical chemistry on completion of a 3000 level course in chemical analysis. The Makhija Prize in Chemistry is awarded from this fund to the student with the best overall performance in 3000-level courses in Chemistry.

Established by friends, family and teammates in memory of Tariq Rafi '86 who embodied the spirit of Trent rugby. To be awarded to the Trent men's rugby varsity player who in the view of coaches and players, stands out for strength, courage and perseverance.

» Victor T. Ridley Memorial Prize

A gift from Mrs. F. Millard in memory of the late Victor T. Ridley of Peterborough. Awarded to the leading undergraduate in first-year Mathematics.

» J. J. Robinette Prize

Awarded in honour of the late Dr. John J. Robinette, an eminent constitutional and criminal lawyer, and Trent University's fifth chancellor. Awarded to the scholastically outstanding graduate of Trent University in any year who undertakes the study of law at another Canadian university.

» Otto Roesch Memorial Prize

Established in memory of the late Professor Otto Roesch (Anthropology). Awarded to the outstanding student in ANTH 3991H: Theories of Society and Culture. This prize recognizes the contributions of Professor Roesch and his research interests in cultural anthropology.

» Barbara Rooke Prize

Established in memory of the late Professor Barbara Rooke. Awarded to the best student in a 3000-level English Literature course in the Romantics.

» Dr. Ben Chan/Julie Schindeler Indigenous Languages Prize

Established by Dr. Ben Chan and Julie Schindeler '82. Awarded annually to an undergraduate student with the highest grade in an Indigenous Language course.

» J. Paul Scott Jr. Memorial Prize

Established in memory of J. Paul Scott Jr. Awarded to a deserving student enrolled in PSYC 4010Y or 4020D (Honours Thesis).

» Carlyle Smith Prize in Psychology

Awarded to a third- or fourth-year student who has shown outstanding performance on a project or paper concerning sleep, sleep disorders, or dreams.

» Denis Smith Essay Prize

The gift of the Political Studies Department. Awarded each year to a fourth-year student submitting an outstanding essay in Political Studies.

» Joseph So Prize in Biological/Medical Anthropology

Established by Professor Emeritus Joseph So who taught Anthropology at Trent for 33 years. To be awarded to student(s) who have completed a biological or medical anthropology course. Based upon academic excellence in the course and the instructor's recommendation.

» Society of Chemical Industry Student Merit Award

Awarded to the student having the highest academic standing in the final year of his or her course. The student must have a minimum average of 75% and have completed a Chemistry-related degree in the normal number of years.

» Sophia Prize

Established in 1999 to honour Professor Robert Carter on his retirement. Awarded to an outstanding third- or fourth-year student who best exemplifies philosophy as the love of wisdom.

» Gillian Stamp Volleyball Prize

Awarded to the player, selected by her team mates who, continually demonstrates dedication, commitment and loyalty to her team both on and off the playing field. Through leadership, fair play and enthusiasm, she is an inspiration to her team mates in their pursuit of academic excellence, volleyball or another sport.

» John Stanford First Year Psychology Prize

This prize is in recognition of a former faculty member who had a fundamental influence in the early development of Trent's Psychology program, including the Introductory Psychology course. This prize is awarded to the student achieving the highest combined grade average in Introductory Psychology courses PSYC 1020H and PSYC 1030H.

» Stantec Prize

A prize will be awarded to a full-time student who is enrolled in the Environmental Geoscience program at Trent Peterborough. Awarded to students based upon the top average after third year.

» Robert W. F. Stephenson Prize

Established by the Alumni Association, family, and friends to honour the first alumnus to chair the Board of Governors. The \$500 prize recognizes a student who has demonstrated excellence in contribution to student governance.

» Student Accessibility Services (SAS) Prize for Self-Advocacy

Awarded annually to an undergraduate student actively registered with Student Accessibility Services (SAS) and who has completed 2+ years of post-secondary study at Trent University. The winning candidate will have exceptional self-advocacy skills and have completed a SAS Prize Application Form. For more information contact Student Accessibility Services.

» Symons Essay Prizes in Canadian Studies

Established through a gift from T.H.B. Symons, the founding President of Trent University, to recognize excellence in performance in undergraduate Canadian Studies courses in the School for the Study of Canada. Four prizes of \$400 each are awarded for outstanding achievement in the first-year course, and outstanding essays in the second, third, and fourth-year courses.

» John Syrett Prize in History

Named in honour of one of the History Department's most distinguished teachers and historians. Awarded to the second-year student writing the best essay.

» Taylor/McMahon Bursary €

Established by Trent alumni, Katherine Taylor and Patrick McMahon. Preference will be given to full-time or part-time undergraduate Indigenous women in any year of the Indigenous Bachelor of Education program, based upon financial need.

» Berna Theobalds Prize

Established in memory of an exceptional resident of Peterborough. Awarded to the student with the highest standing in IDST 2000Y: Development Analysis.

» The Trent Business Students' Association Prize

Established by the TBSA Executive Team. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate business student in Peterborough in any year, with a minimum 70% cumulative average. The student recipient will be chosen based on demonstrated contribution to student life at Trent University through extracurricular activities or volunteerism.

» Trent Women's Rugby Alumni Prize

To be awarded to a second, third or fourth year student on the Excalibur varsity women's rugby team who, in the view of coaches embodies commitment, courage, perseverance and dedication.

» Harold F. VanDusen Prize

Awarded to a student who has completed the third quarter of the Honours Economics program and who has demonstrated exceptional promise. Value \$500.

» Champlain College Master's Prize

Awarded to the graduating student of the College with the highest overall standing in fourth year, Honours degree program.

» Christopher Greene Award

Established in honour of Christopher Greene, former senior tutor of Champlain College. Awarded to a graduating student within the College who has demonstrated considerable academic improvement while studying at Trent University.

» John Rymes Book Award

A book prize awarded by Champlain College to a student of the College who has benefited most from a Trent University education.

» Dale Standen Prize

In honour of Professor Dale Standen, a long-serving member of the History Department. Awarded to the Lady Eaton College History student who has achieved the highest cumulative average at the end of the third year.

» John Stanford Award

This award was created to recognize the relation of Cabinet and the College Office. Principal Stanford, over his years at our College, became a role model for many members who were elected into leadership positions. The nomination should also outline how you ask for help and an example of when you asked for help and what was the outcome. This prize is accompanied by an honorarium of \$150 and presented at the annual Otonabee College Awards Reception.

» Douglas Bruce Prize

Created in memory of Douglas Bruce, who began his studies at Trent at the age of 78 and took every upper-year Greek or Latin course offered within Ancient History & Classics until he passed away in 2004 at the age of 87. The Prize is awarded annually to an upper-year student at Otonabee College for excellence in the study of the ancient world.

» College Heads Prize

Awarded to three members of the graduating class who have made an outstanding contribution to the life of Otonabee College. These prizes are presented at the annual Otonabee College Graduation Dinner.

» Ivana Elbl Prize

» Gordon Johnston Prize for Artistic Excellence

This prize is accompanied by an honorarium and presented at the annual Otonabee College Awards Reception. Nominations are reviewed by the Otonabee College Advisory Council to select a recipient. » Elwood Jones Prize in History

Established in honour of the building's tenth anniversary. Awarded to the graduating student who best exemplifies relationship-building across collegial communities in the spirit of the building's name (Enwayaang, "the way we speak together"). Recipients will have demonstrated engagement in the college community and a commitment to developing strong relationships between groups, departments or organizations in Enwayaang. By Nomination.

» Peter Gzowski Residence Life Award

Awarded in recognition of a student's outstanding contribution to the Peter Gzowski College residence community. Chosen by the dons of Gzowski College. A framed certificate is presented to the student.

» Highest Standing College Prizes

Prizes awarded to the continuing full-time College students with the highest academic standing during each of the first, second and third years of their academic program.

» Robert Lightbody Prize

Established by the Alumni Association to honour the contributions to the University of alumnus Robert Lightbody, a member of Trent's first class. Originally awarded to an upper-year Peter Robinson College student, the prize is now awarded to an upper-year student in its successor college, Peter Gzowski College. The recipient has been actively involved in the life of the College and has maintained a minimum B+ average. By Nomination.

» Peter Robinson College Students' Prize

Established in 2005 by the students of Peter Robinson College. Awarded to a Peter Gzowski College undergraduate student who has made a significant contribution to the University community and has a minimum C+ average. By Nomination.

Trent University Durham Prizes

» Roger Anderson Prize in Policing and Community Well-Being

This prize was established by the Durham Regional Police Services Board in memory of former Durham Regional Chair & CEO, Roger Anderson. One award is available to a full-time student enrolled at Trent Durham in the Policing & Community Well-Being program. By application.

» Canadian Jamaican Club of Oshawa Prize

To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student enrolled at Trent Durham, and who has completed at least one year in any program and has proven financial need and academic achievement. The recipient will demonstrate involvement with multicultural matters i.e. clubs, community work or areas of study focused on multicultural topics in the Durham Region.

» Corus Entertainment Student Prize

Awarded to an undergraduate student entering fourth-year in the Journalism and Creative Writing Program at Trent Durham GTA. This prize is based upon academic excellence to students going on an experiential-learning work placement.

» Durham JBC Alumni Summer Prize

Established by Julian Blackburn College to acknowledge the achievements of part-time students. Two prizes awarded to Trent Durham students who graduate with the highest academic standing in the Honours and General program with a minimum of 10 Trent University credits. Students must be part-time for at least the two previous sessions.

» Beth Kelly '83 & Family Student Prizes

Awarded to undergraduate students with financial need and in any year and any program at Trent Durham GTA. The chosen students will exhibit a passion and enthusiasm for learning as evidenced by their consistent effort. Students may have satisfactory academic achievement and be a first-generation student, a single parent, a caregiver for a family member, or someone who often provides assistance to other students.

» Kennett, Young and Nobels Outstanding Improvement Prize—Durham

Awarded to a Trent University Durham student demonstrating the most impressive improvement in Psychology's undergraduate Advanced Statistics and Research Design course from the mid-term to the final grade.

» Kennett, Young and Nobels Outstanding Performance Prize—Durham

Awarded to a Trent University Durham student maintaining excellence throughout Psychology's undergraduate Advanced Statistics and Research Design course.

» Prince Hall Masons – Jericho Lodge #32 Prize

To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student enrolled at Trent Durham, who has completed at least one year in any program and has proven academic achievement. The recipient will demonstrate involvement with multicultural matters i.e. clubs, community work or areas of study focused on multicultural topics in the Durham Region.

» Rotary Club of Oshawa Prize

Two prizes will be awarded to full-time students who are enrolled in any program at Trent Durham. Awarded to students based upon a minimum average of 70% and exceptional community service within the greater community. A student who is reaching out to make a difference to the lives of others. By nomination.

» Trent Durham Student Leadership Prize

To support a graduating student who possesses the qualities of an outstanding leader while attending Trent Durham. Someone who has undertaken this journey of growth with humility and has transformed not only him or herself but the organizations and communities around them by generating positive social change. A person who understands that as we learn and grow, we inspire others to learn and grow.

» Trent University Durham Citizenship Awards

The Citizenship Awards recognize Trent University Durham community involvement and community building. They are based on nominations submitted to the Trent University Durham Awards and Prizes Committee after an annual call for nominations.

» Trent University Alumni Prizes—Durham

Prizes are awarded to Trent Durham students who graduate with the highest academic standing in the Honours and General program. Continuing Academic Achievement Prizes are also awarded from this fund and are awarded to the student with the highest cumulative average within each credit category by the end of the academic year (May).

International Prizes

» Dr. Mike Allcott Prize

Established in honour of former Trent International Program Director Dr. A. Michael Allcott by a grateful international Trent alumnus who recognizes and values the impact of Trent International and its Global Citizen Scholarship. Awarded annually to continuing undergraduate international student(s) in recognition of their significant leadership contributions to Trent University and its international community.

» Leonard Conolly Prize

An endowment named in honour of a former Director of Trent International, President Leonard Conolly. President Conolly was active in many international initiatives, including the World University Service of Canada (WUSC), a Canadian non-profit organization working to create a better world for all young people. The endowment provides funds to projects that support international students or the internationalization of the university in some other way. Trent International welcomes proposals that demonstrate outstanding commitment and contributions to the betterment of Trent University. Final decisions on the spending of the interest on the endowment are made by the sitting President.

» Exchange Award

Awarded to an exchange or year-abroad student who has contributed significantly to the promotion of study abroad and to the international life of the University.

» Hulcoop Cup

Named in honour of Barb Hulcoop, a retired Trent staff member who opened up her home and her heart to international students. Awarded to a first-year student in recognition of outstanding contributions to the international life of the University.

» International Student Travel Prize

Awarded annually to an international undergraduate or graduate student with strong academic achievement for travel to a significant heritage site or region of Canada of personal interest. Preference will be given to an international student majoring in, or having been enrolled in undergraduate or graduate courses offered by the School for the Study of Canada, though any international student at Trent is encouraged to apply.

» Jack Matthews Prize

Named in honour of the founding director of the Trent International Program, who symbolizes international understanding in all his endeavours. Awarded to a graduating student to recognize outstanding commitment and contributions to internationalization, both locally and globally.

» David Morrison Prize

Named in honour of a former dean of Arts and Science and director of the Trent International Program. Awarded to an upper-year student, usually in the graduating class, in recognition of substantial involvement in the Trent International Program and genuine devotion to the ideals of internationalization.

» Karanja Njoroge Community Service Prize

Named in honour of the second director of the Trent International Program. Awarded to a student in recognition of his/her active involvement in development education both at Trent University and in the wider community.

» Scotiabank International Student Prize

The Scotiabank International Prize is awarded to students going on a Trent University study abroad program at partner universities in countries where Scotiabank operates. The prize is to cover the additional costs of travel and living expenses. Students will be selected based on academic excellence. Value up to \$3,000.

Experiential Learning Opportunities & Fellowships

» Peter Adams Undergraduate Fund for Northern and Polar Studies

To provide assistance to Canadian and International undergraduate students in the Trent School of the Environment who are conducting research in polar regions. This fund will help supplement a portion of travel costs for course work, field studies, research, experiential learning opportunities, field trips, capstone courses, and research taking place in polar regions, and participation in conferences anywhere in the world where students are presenting on the study of polar regions.

» CIBC Cancer Care Placements

To provide funding to allow fourth year Trent-Fleming School of Nursing Program students to do their final placements in centres of excellence for cancer care.

» First Peoples House of Learning Fund - General

This fund was established by the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph in Canada to support the First Peoples House of Learning at Trent University. This fund will be used to direct assistance to students in financial need, for materials needed for cultural programing, to support experiential learning opportunities such as land-based initiatives, or leadership development offerings for students.

» Herman Kassinger Foundation Experiential Learning Fund

This fund supports undergraduate students at Trent Durham to provide the financial support needed to take advantage of an experiential learning opportunity.

» Mackenzie-Papineau Battalion Memorial Fellowship in History

Established by the Mackenzie-Papineau Memorial Fund, which commemorates the 1500 Canadian volunteers who fought to defend the democratically elected government against fascist forces during the Spanish Civil war of 1936-1939. Awarded annually to a graduate student engaged in research in the Department of History at Trent University. Selection by committee. Value of award is \$10,000.

» Sustainable Agriculture Experiential Learning Fund

This expendable fund can be used for hiring undergraduate students, graduate students, and the equipment and supplies needed for their work.

» Undergraduate Fund for the Study of Canada

To provide funding for Canadian and International undergraduate students who are conducting research to further the study of Canada, travel costs for experiential learning, field trips, capstone courses, research, and participation in conferences anywhere in the world where students are presenting on the study of Canada. Students may apply for funds through the School for the Study of Canada, as may faculty seeking support for initiatives that aim to provide these kinds of opportunities for students.

» Undergraduate Research Internships (TSE)

Three prestigious student internships in the Trent School of the Environment allow undergraduate students to work on research projects over the summer, generally as part of their honours project. The students are under the supervision of a faculty member in the TSE. Application process.

» CPA Ontario Foundation Bursary for Black Student Success

The CPA Ontario Foundation Bursary for Black Student Success is intended to provide financial support to black students who are enrolled in an accounting, finance or business program and are in good academic standing.

» CPA Ontario Foundation Bursary for Indigenous Student Success

The CPA Ontario Foundation Bursary for Indigenous Student Success is intended to provide financial support to Indigenous students who are enrolled in an accounting, finance or business program and are in good academic standing.

» Cremers Brothers Electric Ltd. Award for Athletic Financial Assistance

To be awarded to an entering or returning full-time undergraduate student athlete in any program who participates in Trent varsity or intramural sports and who attended a Peterborough City or County high school. Each award has a value of \$1,000. OTSS guidelines apply.

» The Joyce Family Foundation Bursary

» Harold "Pat" Dooley Bursary

Established by Pat Dooley at the age of 94 in 2001 in order to support his commitment to assisting students. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Torben Drewes Student Assistance Fund

Established by former students, colleagues and friends to celebrate the retirement of Torben Drewes a highly respected professor and mentor to many students; an influential contributor to public policy research. To be awarded to international undergraduate students who have proven financial need. Preference will be given to students in any year and enrolled in a single- or joint-major in Economics with a minimum GPA of B.

» James Eades Memorial Bursary

Established in memory of Jamie Eades, who attended Trent (1983–85) after sustaining a serious head injury in a bicycle accident. » Sara Bursary

Established for a student or students enrolled in part-time studies with a minimum average of 66%. Preference will be given to sole-support parents who have completed at least five courses towards an undergraduate degree. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Sally Stavro Bursary

Established in honour of Sally Stavro, a Toronto philanthropist. This bursary will be awarded to an upper-level mature student majoring in Gender & Social Justice. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» David Tapscott Bursary

Established by his family in memory of David Tapscott ('69). Awarded to a student in any year. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Austin James Taylor and Levi Raymond Taylor Philosophy Bursary

Established by Connie Bonello, a member of Trent University's Board of Governors and advocate for a liberal arts education, in honour of her nephews. Awarded to single-major General or Honours students in the Philosophy program with financial need. This bursary is available to Canadian students.

Established by Morden Yolles, a structural engineer who worked closely with Trent architect Ron
Thom on many of the Trent University buildings, including the design of the Reginald Faryon
Bridge. Awarded to undergraduate students enrolled in the Environmental & Resource Science/
Studies program. Preference will be given to promising students in their final year of study. OSOTF
guidelines apply.

» Kathleen Taylor Bursary

Kathleen Taylor was the first woman in Canada to chair a national bank and she received an honorary degree from Trent in 2014 for her accomplishments. These bursaries are available to full-time undergraduate students in any program who are residents of the Regional Municipality of Durham and are pursuing a degree at Trent Durham GTA. Based upon demonstrated financial need.

» Trent University Durham Student Bursaries

Established by J. J. McGuire, the contractors who renovated the Trent Durham Campus in 2010. To be awarded to full-time or part-time students enrolled in any program on the Durham campus. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Trent University Durham Student Association Bursary

Established in 2009 by the student association at Durham College, UOIT, and Trent University Durham. To be awarded to a full-time Trent University Durham campus student in any program. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Ed & Sylvia Vanhaverbeke Durham Bursaries

Established by the founders of Syvan Developments Limited who believe in supporting students in their region. Two annual bursaries of \$500 each will be awarded to support students with the most financial need and enrolled full-time or part-time at Trent Durham GTA.

» Harry Kitchen Student Assistance Fund

Established by Professor Emeritus Harry M. Kitchen, who taught in the Economics Department at Trent University for 40 years. He was awarded the Queen's Diamond Jubilee medal for policy analysis and research contributions to municipal finance, structure, and governance in Canada. Students should submit their application in January to the Trent WUSP-SRP Local Committee, demonstrating their leadership performance while attending Trent University. Awarded to students in their 2nd, 3rd, or 4th year of study.

» History Award

Established by an '83 alumnus, faculty members, and other concerned alumni of the History Department. This award will be granted to a worthy undergraduate History student. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Bernard Hodgson Memorial Award

Established by family, colleagues, students, and friends in memory of Bernard Hodgson, professor of Philosophy at Trent from 1974 to 2009. His special interests included the philosophy of the natural and human sciences, ethical theory, and epistemology/metaphysics. To be awarded to a student majoring in Philosophy and proceeding from third to fourth year, and based upon financial need and academic achievement. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Agneta Holt Award

Established by the University Women's Club of Peterborough as a memorial to the late Mrs. Agneta Holt. Awarded to a female undergraduate student, in any program, who demonstrates academic scholarship. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Dr. Jennifer Ingram Awards

Established to honour Dr. Jennifer Ingram, a specialist in Internal Medicine and Geriatric Medicine and a recipient of a 2007 Trent Community Leaders Award. Awarded to students who have demonstrated academic excellence and financial need and are enrolled in Trent-Fleming School of Nursing Program courses at the 3000 or 4000 level, or to third- or fourth-year undergraduate students in the Psychology program. Preference will be given to students exhibiting an interest in community development and/or the health of seniors. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Kawartha Credit Union Award

Kawartha Credit Union is a socially responsible company and makes significant and positive contributions to the communities they serve through their Community Involvement Program. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student enrolled in the Business Administration program based upon financial need and academic achievement. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Lightbody CPTC Award

Established by Bob and Margaret Lightbody, alumni of Trent's first class of '64 and devoted Trent volunteers. Awarded to undergraduate students affiliated with Traill College that have an academic average of B in any program. Students must have financial need. Preference will be given to students who are engaged in the life of Traill College. OTSS guidelines apply.

» LLF Lawyers Award

Established by a Peterborough law firm. Awarded to a full-time undergraduate student who demonstrates high academic achievement and financial need. Preference will be given to students majoring in Business Administration. OTSS guidelines apply.

» LLF Awards for Trent/Swansea

Created by LLF Lawyers for students in the Trent/Swansea Dual Degree Law & Arts/Business program to encourage diversity and equity in the legal profession. These awards will be given out to Trent students travelling to attend Swansea University Law School after completing their second year at Trent, with demonstrated academic achievement, financial need and involvement with community/extracurricular activities. Students will submit an application and be chosen by group committee.

» Lopes Family Award for Study Abroad

Established by Ana P. Lopes, a Trent Governor Emerita and honorary alumna, in honour of her parents, Antonio F. and Gertrude M. Lopes, originally of Lisbon, Portugal, in recognition of their interest in politics and current affairs, and their leadership and community service within the Portuguese-speaking community of Canada. Awarded to Ontario undergraduate and graduate students based upon financial need and an excellent academic record. Awarded to undergraduate students going on a Trent study-abroad program; and to graduate students studying and researching as part of a Trent program, or participating in a conference. Preference will be given to students travelling to Europe. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Jean McKerracher Business Administration Award

Awarded to Business Administration student(s) with a Specialization of Entrepreneurship. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Moore Family Award

Established in 2004 by David and Joan Moore. David is a passionate advocate for Trent, having served on the Board of Governors from 1981 to 1996 and having chaired the For Tomorrow Campaign. A lifetime appointment as honorary governor was granted in 1996. Awarded to undergraduate students who demonstrate achievement and financial need. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Nantes Year-Abroad Program Student Support

This fund will assist Trent undergraduate students with financial need to participate in the Nantes Year-Abroad Program.

» Reid & Margaret Morden Award in the Humanities

Established by Reid and Margaret Morden in support of an undergraduate student demonstrating financial need as well as high academic achievement in the areas of history, political science, or sociology. Reid Morden served as chair of Trent's Board of Governors from 2002 to 2008. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Patricia & David Morton Indigenous Studies Undergraduate Award €
Established in 2007 by Honorary Degree recipient and former president and CEO of Quaker
Oats of Canada, David L. Morton, and Trent University professor emerita, Patricia Morton. To be awarded to undergraduate students of Aboriginal heritage. OTSS guidelines apply.

» T. E. W. Nind Award

Established in memory of Professor T. E. W. (Tom) Nind, president of Trent University from 1972 to 1979. Awarded to a major or joint-major in Mathematics who demonstrates financial need and high academic standing. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Bonnie M. Patterson Athletic Financial Award

Created as a tribute to Bonnie Patterson, President & Vice Chancellor of Trent University from 1998-2009. Awarded to returning full-time undergraduate students participating in the varsity athletics program on the recommendation of the Director, Athletics and approval by the President, Trent University. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Sarah D. Patterson Award for Aboriginal Language Studies &

Established in memory of Sarah D. Patterson (1889–1979), a Mohawk of the Bear Clan who was born at Six Nations and spoke four languages: Mohawk, Cayuga, Tuscarora, and English. Awarded to an upper-year or graduate student of high academic standing who is in financial need and shows a keen interest in Aboriginal languages.

» Peterborough Horticultural Society Award

Established by the Peterborough Horticultural Society (founded in 1861) and in honour of Ann Greer-Wootten, past president. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student who is majoring in Environmental & Resource Sciences/Studies and who has an interest in our natural world and its preservation. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Greg & Laura Piasetzki Award

Established by Greg ('72) and Laura Piasetzki. Awarded annually to returning students in Chemistry and returning students in Forensic Science. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Prendiville Family Travel Award for Study Abroad

Having spent time studying and working in other countries, Anne-Marie Prendiville and John Gillies established this award so that students can experience the joy of learning about a country and a culture different from their own. Three members of the Prendiville family graduated from Trent: Anne-Marie (LEC '69), Richard (CC '72), and Clare (JBC '76). Awarded to undergraduate students based upon financial need and an excellent academic record and going on a Trent study-abroad program. Preference will be given to students going on the Nantes, France, year-abroad program.

» David Rae Memorial Award

A gift from family members. Awarded to a student entering fourth year of any academic program who has demonstrated academic excellence and financial need.

» Peter L. Roach Award

Established to honour Peter L. Roach, director of Education from 1975 to 1992, in recognition of his years of service to the Peterborough, Victoria, Northumberland & Clarington Roman Catholic Separate School Board. In selecting the recipient, priority will be given to a student who has studied in the PVNC Separate School system and who displays academic excellence and financial need. The funding for this award was provided initially by the employees of the PVNC Separate School Board through the For Tomorrow Campaign and by friends and associates of Mr. Peter Roach. Additional funding was provided by donations to the Ontario Student Opportunity Trust Fund. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Rural Ontario Municipal Association Award

Established by the Rural Ontario Municipal Association (ROMA). Two awards will be granted annually to students enrolled in a humanities or social sciences program. Preference will be given to first generation students with financial need as chosen by application to the Office of the Dean of Humanities and Social Sciences.

» Patricia H. Southern Mathematics Award

Established in 2004 by Patricia H. Southern, FCA, and a member of Trent's Board of Governors. Awarded to one or two students in third or fourth year who demonstrate high academic achievement and financial need. Preference will be given to students majoring in Mathematics. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Gerry and Mary Stephenson Award

Dedicated to the memory of Gerry Stephenson, an avid canoe historian. Awarded to a third-year student in History or Canadian Studies. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Swish Maintenance Limited Athletic Award

This award was established by a local Peterborough company, founded by Walter Ambler in 1956. To be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student athlete in any program, who participates in Trent varsity sports. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Colin Taylor Award

Established by colleagues and friends of Colin Taylor to honour his service as teacher and researcher and his administrative service as chair of the Geography Department (1980–84), associate dean of Arts and Science (1984–88), associate dean of Research and Graduate Studies (1990–95), acting dean of Arts and Science (three terms), and dean of Arts and Science (1997–02 and 2003–06). Awarded to a student registered in his/her final year of any Honours undergraduate program who has improved the intellectual and academic life of the University. OTSS guidelines apply.

» TD Green Undergraduate Awards

To support full-time undergraduate students with financial need and working towards undergraduate degrees in: Environmental & Resource Science, Environmental & Resource Studies, Geography, Chemistry, Indigenous Environmental Studies, Biology, Bachelor of Environmental Science/Studies, Water Sciences and Ecological Restoration. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Thesis Eleven Award

Established by colleagues, students, and friends in honour of Professor Emeritus Constantin Boundas and Mrs. Ke-Ryang Choi-Boundas. Preference will be given to single-major Honours students in Philosophy in second year or above. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» Edward Tremain Award for Study Abroad

Established in memory of Ted Tremain, a dedicated honorary member of the Board of Governors. It is to be awarded to a third- or fourth-year student going on a Trent study abroad program. The award is based on financial need and an excellent academic record. OTSS guidelines apply.

» Trent University Foundation Awards

These awards are the gifts of current and past volunteer directors and staff of the Trent University Foundation. They are awarded to full-time undergraduate students who have successfully completed first year in an Honours program. Preference will be given to students in the humanities and social sciences. OSOTF guidelines apply.

» John Wadland Award

Awarded to the most worthy undergraduate students with financial need in any year of the Canadian Studies Program or to students who are taking a significant number of Canadian Studies courses. It is also be awarded to graduate students in financial need in the MA Canadian Studies & Indigenous Studies and Ph.D. in Canadian Studies programs. This award is in recognition of John Wadland's seminal role in introducing students to Canadian Studies over three decades through CAST 200 "Canada: the Land." OTSS guidelines apply.

» John Wadland Undergraduate Award for Canadian & International Students

To be awarded to the most worthy students with financial need in any year of the Canadian Studies Program, or students in the Diploma for Canadian Studies program, or students who are taking a significant number of Canadian Studies courses. This award is in recognition of John Wadland's seminal role in introducing students to Canadian Studies over three decades through CAST 200 "Canada: the Land." Available to Canadian and international students.

» WB Family Foundation Award in Environmental & Resource Science/StudiesEstablished by the WB Family Foundation. Awarded to an undergraduate student enrolled in the Environmental & Resource Science/Studies program who demonstrates both academic excellence and financial need. OSOTF guidelines apply.
