Enrolment Requirements	A full-time enrolment is 32 credit points per session – this is usually 4x 8 credit point subjects.	
	<ul> <li>We recommend you select a minimum of 6 subjects per session (8 recommended) in case of any changes to class scheduling prior to arrival.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>All subjects must be available at your chosen campus. It is not possible to commute between campuses.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Check all selected subjects are offered on-campus (internal delivery); however a maximum of one 8 credit point subject may be studied online (external delivery) if it is not available internally on your selected campus.</li> </ul>

	Charles Sturt will arrange OSHC for all students, with coverage starting from 2 weeks prior to the start of the session until 2 months after the end of your session.
