## Fact Sheet - Academic Year 2026/27

	<p>Most exchange opportunities are for level 5 undergraduate programmes and students need to have completed the first year in a related undergraduate degree prior to arrival. Students will need to provide any available academic transcripts. For postgraduate exchanges we require evidence of an appropriate undergraduate qualification.</p> <p>Students are required to select a minimum credit load of 60 CATS (30 ECTS) per semester. Alternative modules may be offered to applicants depending on demand for places and timetabling considerations.</p>
<b>Language Requirements</b>	<p>For students studying with us for one semester, we will accept confirmation from the partner as part of the nomination process that the student meets the requirements as set out in our agreement.</p> <p>Students coming for the full academic year will need to apply for a Student Visa and will need to have a <a href="#">Secure English Language Test qualification</a> (SELT).</p>
<b>Visa Requirements</b>	<p><b>Visa Requirements</b></p> <p>To study in the UK on an exchange for a semester (up to six months or less) students require a Standard Visitor Visa. Students whose nationality is listed on the UK Government's Non Visa National list are required to apply for this in advance – see <a href="#">Immigration Rules Appendix Visitor: Visa national list - Guidance - GOV.UK</a>. Students whose nationality is not listed can secure this on arrival at the UK border.</p> <p>Certain nationalities can apply for an ETA (Electronic Travel Authority) instead of applying for a Standard Visitor Visa in advance of travel: <a href="http://www.gov.uk/guidance/apply-for-an-electronic-travel-authorisation-eta">www.gov.uk/guidance/apply-for-an-electronic-travel-authorisation-eta</a></p> <p>Students studying in the UK for a full academic year will need to apply for a Student Visa and also have a <a href="#">Secure English Language Test qualification</a> (SELT) in order to secure their visa.</p>
