Application procedure

It is expected that partners nominate approved students via email to studyabroad@dundee.ac.uk prior to student applying. Students will be contacted by our Admissions team and must submit their applications by the deadline below unless a request has been made by partner for late submission.

E-portfolio (if applicable)

Nominated art and architecture students are expected to prepare an e-portfolio of 12-15 digital images to support their application. Once the student has submitted their online application to us, they will be sent specific instructions on how and where to upload their e-portfolio images. The quality of the portfolio can be the deciding factor in whether a student is accepted or not.

English language requirement

All applicants require to have English Language proficiency at a minimum of CEFR Level B2 or equivalent.

If English is NOT your first language, you will need to demonstrate that you have the language skills you need to study with us.

If you require a VISA to study with us OR if English is not the language of instruction at your home university you will be required to fulfil our English Language Requirements found [here](#)

If you do not require a VISA to study with us and English is the language of instruction at your home university, we will accept a formal statement attesting to your English language proficiency from your home university.

Credit equivalency

A full Credit Load for one semester is 60 UoD Credits = 30 ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System)

Transcripts

For **semester 1** students transcript of results will be issued late January to early February to student and home institution

For **semester 2** or full year students transcripts of results will be issued late June to early July to student and home institution

Student Application Journey

- Go Abroad Team receives a student's nomination from their home institution and shares it with Admissions Team
- Admissions Team sends application information and guidance directly to nominated student copying in their home institution
- Student submits application, academic transcript, evidence of English language (where applicable) and completed Module Choice form
- Student should discuss any Module Choice queries with their UoD Go Abroad Academic Co-ordinator and/or Advisor of studies at their home university
- Student must respond to notifications to accept their offer confirming their place
- Student will then receive information on how to apply for housing
- Admissions Team will provide them with any further information they require
