Visa Information (continued)

- Students will be provided with a Standard Visitor Letter by Essex Abroad to show at the UK border.
- Students are NOT allowed to work.
- Students are permitted to undertake volunteering (for a registered Charity organisation / no more than 30 days in total)
- Health surcharge not required if students are eligible under the government healthcare rules. If not eligible, any NHS treatment will be payable unless it's a free service
- Students must ensure they have adequate health insurance cover before leaving their home country.

Assessment	
Types of Assessment	Assignments and tests with exams at the end of the academic year.
	Autumn students and calendar year students will have exams (where required) at the end of December 2026 or beginning of January 2027.
	Spring/Summer Term students, full year students or Calendar Year students will have exams (where required) during the summer term (May/June 2027).
Academic standards	Pass mark for Undergraduate modules (levels 4, 5 and 6) = 40 out of 100
	Pass mark for Postgraduate modules (levels 7 and 8) = 50 out of 100
Board of Examiners (Exam Board)	At Essex, all coursework and exam marks must be ratified at a formal Board of Examiners meeting. The Board will review and confirm the marks.
	The Board of Examiners will also consider all Extenuating Circumstances claims submitted by students and if accepted determine the best course of action, based on what is permissible under the Rules of Assessment.
	The Board of Examiners meeting for students only completing Autumn Term modules and students studying over a Calendar Year will take place in February 2027 .
	The Board of Examiners meeting for students only completing Spring/Summer Term modules or Full Academic Year modules and students studying over a Calendar Year will take place in July 2027 .
Official Academic Transcript	The Official academic transcript will be available after the Board of Examiners Meeting has ratified the marks. An electronic copy of the academic transcript will be sent both to the student and home university by email.
	The academic transcript for Autumn Term only students and Calendar Year students will normally be issued by end of February 2027 .
	The academic transcript for Spring/Summer Term only students and Full Academic Year students will normally be issued by end of July 2027 .

Reassessment	Some students may be offered the option of voluntary reassessment if they have failed one / some of their modules. This will be offered at the point when the final marks are released.
	A deadline to make the decision whether or not to take reassessment or accept the existing mark will be given. It will be presumed that students do not wish to take reassessment if no decision is made by the given deadline, and an academic transcript with existing marks will be issued.
	Reassessment for all incoming exchange students (including Autumn Term students) will take place in August 2027 for coursework and September 2027 for exams. Please note that the exams may take place in-person or virtually.
	Academic transcripts will not be issued until all marks have been ratified at a Resit Board of Examiners meeting. This will take place in October 2027 .

Accommodation	
Types of University maintained accommodation	All students studying for a term, an academic year, or a calendar year, are able to apply for on-campus accommodation, but need to apply by the published deadlines.

	Essex offers single study bedrooms with shared kitchen facilities and either a shared or ensuite bathroom. If students are studying at the Colchester Campus they must only select accommodation at our Colchester Campus and students studying at the Southend Campus must only select accommodation at our Southend Campus.
	Students can apply for accommodation for autumn term only, spring/summer term only, full academic year or calendar year.
Private accommodation	If students do not wish to apply for campus accommodation, the Student Union may be able to offer assistance to find private local accommodation options.

Holiday Arrangements	Accommodation remains open during the Christmas and Easter holidays. All students are required to vacate their rooms at the end of the Summer term (June 2027).
	Students may choose to leave their accommodation early if their exams finish before the end of term, however, it is not possible to shorten contracts, and students will be liable to pay accommodation fees until the end of the summer term or until their contract end date.
Accommodation application deadline	Accommodation is arranged via Essex Abroad and students will be notified in:
deadine	 August/September 2026 for October entry December 2026 for January entry.
	Students are not permitted to apply for on-campus accommodation other than through Essex Abroad.
Accommodation fee	We offer a range of different types of accommodation, from shared facilities to ensuite rooms. The costs of each type of accommodation varies.
	Accommodation payments will be due within the first month of arrival/beginning of each term. The Accommodation team will manage this.
